## Never Forget U.N.

Daniel P. Moynihan, the United States Ambassador to the United Nations, told the concluding session of the 30th General Assembly "there are events that occurred in the 30th Assembly which the United States will never forget." This is even more true for the Jewish people.

The 1975 Assembly session will be remembered as a continuous assault on Israel and the Jewish people, culminating in the resolution equating Zionism with racism. It was a session in which every Jew both in the United States and elsewhere felt under personal attack. Israeli Ambassador, Chaim Herzog, who summed up the session as a "concentration of cynicism, hypocrisy and one-sidedness," was correct in labelling the UN as "the main center of anti-Zionism in the world."

The Israeli envoy was also correct for repeatedly pointing out that at least one-third of the Assembly's time was taken up with senseless attacks on Israel while the real problems facing the world were ignored. There was hardly a day when the Assembly was not deluged with a barrage of anti-Israel and anti-Jewish statements and resolutions.

This anti-Israel attack continues in other UN forums such as UNESCO and should reach a new low when the Security Council discusses the Middle East in January. All of this has contributed to a lessening of the chances for peace in the Middle East. Some political scientists have called the UN "a dangerous place" because the debates and resolutions, instead of lessening tensions around the world, have added to them.

The Third World countries which have for various reasons allowed themselves to be used by the Arab states and the Communist Bloc must wake up before it is too late. The UN helped in the birth of these nations and they need it the most. But as Herzog noted, the UN action harmed the international organization more than it did Israel. Moynihan also warned that, as a result of the resolution equating Zionism with racism the "UN may not survive in our time."

Perhaps the action by the United States, Israel and 10 other countries in walking out of the UNESCO meeting in Paris because of the inclusion of an anti-Zionism resolution, will be a deterrent. Unless there is a change in this anti-Israel orgy in UN forums, the world organization may indeed "not survive in our time."

## U.N. Session Tragedy

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- As the 30th session of the General Assembly adjourned in infamy last week by putting its seal of approval on all the previous anti-Israeli resolutions adopted in the various committees -- there were few changes of heart, neither by Mexico nor by Brazil although their spokesmen tried to justify themselves by denying that their vote on Zionism had meant what it had implied (a poor excuse) -- Ambassadors Chaim Herzog and Moynihan

summed up the Arafatian and Idi Amin-inspired world organization in plain and simple words.

Moynihan termed it a "Theatre of the Absurd" while Herzog likened the UN proceedings to "a Greek tragedy in which the Organization was inexorably dragged down against its will to the base levels of human dissension, intransigent hate and unbridled vituperation." However, he did express his appreciation "to all those states, large and small, that had refused to be dictated to by the purveyors of hatred and discrimination."

That there were quite a number of such pro-Israel states goes without saying, but, as the world now knows, they were outnumbered by the 'tyranny of the majority' comprising, in the main, of the Soviet-Arab and the so-called third world blocs.

And speaking of blocs -- and to understand fully the innate hatred still burning within the bosoms of so many nations against the Jewish peoples as was so starkly borne out at the 30th session -- one must go back to antiquity, to biblical history. The present must be viewed in the light of the past in order to comprehend why we have now, in this 20th century, witnessed a 'Greek Tragedy' in this 'Theatre of the Absurd.'

For indeed, it is 'Babylon-Chaldea-Assyria' versus 'Israel', in all her twelve tribes, all over again; it's the continuation of the ancient conflict in a modern setting.

And this conflict is not only between reborn Israel -- that is Judah or Jewry -- and the resurrected 'tyranny of the majority.' It is also between the hitherto unidentified Ten Tribes, the House of Israel as distinct from Judah that is, the Western states comprising NATO and its allies and the Soviet - Arab - third world alignment.

That this is so has become crystal-clear from what we have witnessed during this 30th session of the General Assembly.

We referred to "Israel, in all her twelve tribes." Well, this writer, who has devoted many years of research into the subject of the so-called ten 'lost' tribes of Israel, is convinced that many of them exist today, some of them powerful nations, on the world scene, and America, founded upon biblical principles, stands out as one of them. It becomes understandable, therefore, why Daniel Patrick Moynihan took such a valiant stand here in defense of the Jewish people against their detractors.

Rabbi Arthur Hertzberg's article in Moment Magazine.....The rate of intermarriage today is of the order of 30 percent. On present trends, the end of the diaspora is thinkable in the 21st century, and it is this awesome possibility which presents the largest single immediate Jewish problem.....The problem which Jewish learning raises for our communal leaders is that it poses a radical challenge to values and even to lifestyles.... To put it bluntly, even brutally: the modern Jewish community of the Diaspora is constructed of Jews who are busy at the business of being Jews without involving their interior beings, their selves,.... We must now provide a free Jewish education to every Jewish child everywhere in the world, .... It is undoubtedly true that a variety of institutions which have at present a major investment in purveying Jewish education for a fee, such as the synagogues, would be radically affected. Obviously, the vastly increased costs the Jewish community would assume in such a venture would affect negatively some of our existing programs. .... A Jewish community that takes its own culture and ethos more seriously could find ways of constructing a Jewish Peace Corps for the young people of the Diaspora. .... Jewish learning is everybody's business .... That leadership has also the prime responsibility for the survival of its own community and here the American Jewish leaders are on the bridge of a very leaky ship....It is expensive and uncomfortable -- it will soil our dinner jackets -- to go down into the boiler room and try to stanch the seepage. But it is peril, not rhetoric, that beckons us; it is a Jewish community of five and a half million people, the largest in the world, that is in jeopardy, and it is therefore we, too, who can now, must now, adopt as our credo ein breirah -- there is no alternative.

whole question connected with the "lost" tribes of Israel becomes all the more important and assumes far greater meaning in this our atomic age that is witnessing two basic world ideologies in conflict: the Western and the Eastern; the democratic, Bible-nurtured, God-fearing ideology versus the totalitarian, the atheistic, anti-Bible concept.

The issue facing the world today, let us re-emphasize, is quite clear. The East - West struggle on the global scene, the battle between the Soviet - Arab bloc of peoples and the Western grouping of nations, appears to be nothing other than the continuation of the ancient conflict between 'Babylonia-Assyria' and Israel. In plain words, there is nothing new under the sun. The only difference lies in the fact that in antiquity this life-and-death struggle between the two diametrically - opposed forces centered, in the main, around Asia Minor. Today it is global and involves all mankind. The external forms alone have changed.

Summing up the anti-Israeli actions of the 30th session of the General Assembly some hours before it adjourned last week, Ambassador Herzog told the press corps that the world organization had been bedeviled by "two great evils -- hatred and ignorance." He further noted that the concentrated and continuous maneuverings against Israel actually "did very little damage to the Jewish State and world Jewry. The real damage," he stressed, "was done to the UN itself as an institution whose main objectives according to the Charter must be to harmonize relations among Member states through negotiations."

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) General Assembly President Goston Thorn, meeting with the press corps here last week, declared that although "many delegations had asked me to withdraw my statement" scoring all those nations who had voted for or even abstained on the vote equating Zionism with racism, he had refused to do so or "to apologize for it" as he had been requested to do by the Arabs and most of the third world states.
