KIAMESHA LAKE, N. Y. NEW YORK (WNS) -- The B'nai B'rith Anti-Defamation League has reported that the Venezuelan Ministry of Foreign Affairs has rejected a request by the Palestine Liberation Organizait be allowed to open an office

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Agudath MK Yehuda Meir Abramowitz has introduced a bill into the Knesset to bar law suits against synagogues located in residential buildings.
