COMIC JERRY COLLINS FEATURED IN BARBARA FAIRCHILD SHOW AT LANDMARK

"Country Music U.S.A." the Landmark Hotel's popular country & western musical revue has reigned in to the Jubilee Room with the first edition of the new year, headlined by Barbara Fairchild and featuring Jerry Collins, Jerry Naylor and Skip De Vol.

Funny man on the scene is Jerry Collins, who is certainly no stranger to Las Vegas, having played almost every major strip hotel as well as having appeared downtown with Marry Robbins on several occasions.

His "Pick and Pat -- Frick and Frack" routine, "I'm not making up these names, folks," has become a classic for the quick-witted performer.

The little ray of sunshine, Barbara Fairchild, has come a long way from the taverns of Knobel, Arkansas to the Las Vegas stage where she has twice appeared with Roy Clark and twice headlined her own Landmark show. Her success story includes the writing of a majority of her own hits as well as songs for other great artists


such as Loretta Lynn, Liz Anderson and J. David Sloan. Her first big break came, however, when Billy Sherrill signed her to Columbia, for which she recorded, among others, "Color My World," her big hit "Teddy Bear Song" and her latest release "I Just Love Being A Woman."

Opening the fast-paced revue is Jerry Naylor, country recording artist who at the age of 14 had formed his own group and was good enough to travel with the Louisiana Hayride as well as perform with such country greats as Horton, Orbison and Cash. Drawing away from country music in the late 50s he joined the strong pop group The Crickets, taking over as front man when the leader Buddy Holly was killed in a plane crash. With his latest hits, "Is That All There Is To A Honky Tonk" and its follow up, "What's A Nice Girl Like You Doing In A Honky Tonk" Naylor has the satisfaction of knowing that country is where his head really belongs.

"Pickin' and Strummin'" on the four or five string banjos, Skip De Vol returns for his sixth edition of CMUSA with a repertoire of tunes from bluegrass to rag-time to modern country ballads -- each done with a special flair that is making the exciting performer not only the "happiest" banjo player in the whole U.S.A." but easily one of the best.
