ZIONIST COUNCIL RAISES ALIYA ISSUE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The question of whether Israel's austerity program was hurting aliya was raised at the opening session of the Zionist General Council's annual meeting.

Leon Dulzin, acting chairman of the World Zionist Organization and Jewish Agency Executives,

charged that the austerity program will decrease aliya. But Premier Yitzhak Rabin replied that if immigrants come the budget will be increased to meet their needs. Dulzin is seeking to be elected WZO chairman by the General Council while Rabin is supporting Haifa Mayor Yosef Almogi.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- A group of 25 Catholic, Protestant and Jewish women have left for a 17-day tour of Egypt, Syria, Jordan and Israel. The tour is co-sponsored by the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (Roman Catholic), United Presbyterian Women, and the American Jewish Committee in cooperation with the Division of Overseas Ministries of the National Council of Churches.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Fashion has accomplished what the pressure of Orthodox groups failed to do. Israel women soldiers, who were allowed to wear mini skirts up to four inches above the knee despite the opposition of religious circles, will now be wearing longer and fuller skirts with matching high leather boots.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Jewish National Fund reported that forest fires destroyed 264,100 trees in Israel last summer.
