The American Civil Liberties Union of Nevada, with Robert Archie as co-operating attorney, has filed an appeal in behalf of Jackson Manuleto, an American Indian, who pled guilty to a vagrancy charge resulting from his having slept in the Greyhound Bus Depot. The case represents a challenge to city and state vagrancy laws, which make it a criminal offense to be without funds and without a home. These laws penalize what might be described as an offensive condition (poverty and rootlessness) rather than criminal behavior. A law which makes it a crime to be poor is unconstitutional.
