RUSSO, ARAB UN MAJORITY SEEKS PLO FOR ALL FUTURE MIDEAST TALKS

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The Security Council which has opened its debate on the Middle East seems to be pointing toward making the Palestine Liberation Organization a full-fledged partner in any future Mideast negotiations.

Not only has the Soviet Union and the Arab countries called for such a role but France, Sweden and Japan indicated that they support a negotiating role for the PLO and felt Israel should reconcile to dealing with it by reversing its boycott of the current council session because of the PLO presence.

But Israeli Ambassador Chaim Herzog, in a press conference after the Council debates had begun, said the speeches at the debate vindicated Israel's decision to boycott the debate. He charged there is an attempt "to skirt the basic issue which is at the root of the problems in the Middle East, namely, that of the right of the Jewish people of national sovereignty and of the attitude of the Arab states to the existence of Israel." He said that Israel was threatened throughout the debate and the Arabs talked only about what Israel should give up without mentioning what Israel should receive in return. Herzog said that Israel is ready to attend the Geneva conference without preconditions with the participation of all the original parties and that the question of the participation of other parties can be discussed at Geneva. Herzog noted the same proposal was recently made by Egyptian President Anwar Sadat. Meanwhile it was learned that Security Council President Salim Ahmed of

PLO WANTS ISRAEL "DOWN ON KNEES"

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Zuhayr Muhsin, second in command and "defense minister" of the Palestine Liberation Organization, has declared that the PLO's aim is to have Israel "down on their knees before us."

In an interview with the West German weekly, Die Zeit, Muhsin, who is also a leader of the Syrian-supported terrorist organization As Sa'iq (Thunderbolt) and of the Syrian Baath Party, said that the PLO's aim in the Security Council debate on the Middle East is to see that the Palestinian question will not be dealt with as a refugee problem but as a political problem of a Palestinian state.

Muhsin said the Palestinians want to "coexist" with the Israelis in a unified secular state "or a state with two cantons." He said Israel will have to accept that this means there cannot be a Jewish state since "our right of existence in all of Palestine comes first."

The PLO official also said that at present the situation is "neither war nor peace. And in the future, war again, new wars. It's inevitable."

State of the Union

President Gerald Ford's State of the Union message told us how much better off we were in 1975 than in 1974 and proposed changes for 1976.

He said we have to have a fundamentally different approach with new principles and a new balance. We're headed in the right direction and we have to halt inflation, he told a joint session of Congress.

Ford will submit a 394.2 billion dollar budget (which is hardly likely. We believe it will be up around the 400 billion mark).

The President suggested a tax cut of ten billion, which means a family of four, earning \$15,000 would pay \$227 less.

His message to senior citizens was to limit any and all medical care for one year to \$500. This would be a tremendous move in the right direction. He called for consolidation of 59 social programs to make them more effective, and to turn them over to the states. (This has already been done in a number of programs and many states have discontinued the services).

Ford admitted the eight percent in unemployment was a sad note. He rejected a program of the government creating new jobs. He proposed giving benefits to big business to put more people to work. (This has a familiar ring.)

On the subject of crime, Ford said we needed more Federal judges to dole out swifter justice with meaning. He said four new Federal penal institutions were on the boards.

On foreign affairs, Ford said since World
