

**JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS**

**UNITED NATIONS (WUP)** -- A Syrian, Abdul-Razzak Kaddoura, has been slated for an important post with the UN Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

**NEW YORK (WUP)** -- Shouting slogans against the PLO murderers and demanding their ouster from Lebanon, some 150 Christians of Lebanese origin demonstrated last week by the Itajah Wall across the street from the UN.

**BOSTON (WNS)** -- Eldridge Cleaver, the former Black Panther leader now in a California prison, has defended Zionism and Israel and declared that "Having lived intimately for several years among the Arabs, I know them to be among the most racist people on earth."

**WASHINGTON (WNS)** -- Israeli Premier Yitzhak Rabin, who will visit the United States for the third time since taking office in June 1974, will address a joint session of Congress.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- The government has decided to hold up its proposal to impose severe criminal penalties on news media publishing classified information.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- The first 38 of up to 200 Americans who will man the Sinai early warning stations have arrived in Israel.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- The attempted bombings at the United Nations and the offices of foreign nations here were denounced by the executive committee of the National Jewish Community Relations Advisory Council.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Spain, the only Western European country never to have had diplomatic relations with Israel, has given a semi-official indication that such ties will be established.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- Israel has a new party, the Labor - State Movement (La-am), which has eight Knesset seats. The party's main ideology is the right of Israel to all the land it now holds.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Cabinet doves were assured by Premier Yitzhak Rabin that the government has not decided to establish a permanent Jewish settlement near Nablus.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Mayor Teddy Kollek cited the transfer of the Joint Distribution Committee's headquarters from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem as a rare example of a non-Zionist organization's sensitivity to the importance of Jerusalem as the site for major Jewish organizations.

**VIENNA (WNS)** -- Nazi hunter Simon Wiesenthal has announced that he was shifting his efforts to track down wanted Nazi war criminals to the United States and other countries and away from Austria because Nazis are almost invariably acquitted by Austria courts.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- A new morning newspaper is scheduled to appear soon with former Defense Minister Moshe Dayan as its editor.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- A total of 50,700 tourists came to Israel in December, the highest December ever. However, overall tourism for 1975 was down totalling 617,500 compared to 624,700 in 1974.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- Rabbi David Polish, president of the Chicago Zionist Federation, has been named chairman of a commission on Zionist ideology set up by the American Zionist Federation.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- More than \$277 million in cash for the development of Israel's economy was raised by the Israel Bond Organization during 1975, according to Michael Arnon, president of Israel Bonds.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- The 250 members of the Prime Minister's Israel Bonds conference ended their in depth study of Israel's economic and industrial problems, by raising their right hands and pledging before President Ephraim Katzir that "every day of the year we will perform some specific act to ensure the continuity of Jewish life in our country and throughout the world."

**WASHINGTON (WNS)** -- The United States and other Western nations should "selectively reduce their involvement in and financial support of UN volunteer agencies as a means of opposing the Arab and Communist blocs' running rough-shod over the UN Charter," the B'nai B'rith board of governors urged at the conclusion of their midwinter meeting.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- The struggle of Soviet Jews to immigrate to Israel is the most important sign of Jewish vitality at a time when Zionism is under attack, Premier Yitzhak Rabin told 450 delegates at the third annual convention of Russian Immigrants in Israel at Kibbutz Shafayim.

**WASHINGTON, D. C. (WNS)** -- President Ford's proposed budget for fiscal year 1977 which starts October 1 includes \$1 billion for military credit sales for Israel, \$500 million less than the President recommended for the 1976 fiscal year.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- The Department of Justice has instituted an anti-trust action against Bechtel, Inc., of San Francisco, for alleged participation in the Arab boycott against Israel.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Rabbi Alexander Schneider, the newly-elected chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, plans to be an outspoken chairman under whom the Conference will "tell Israel the truth as it sees it, not just as it thinks Israel would like to hear it."
