His duties included dealing with the aerospace industry in the selection and procurement aircraft and weapons amounting to billions of dollars annually. He also supervised the policy making for procurement of commercial air lift for the Department of Defense amounting to hundreds of millions of dollars each year.

He founded the Air Force Fighter Center at Nellis Air Force Base in 1966 and gained a reputation as a builder. During his tenure, a \$28 million building program was initiated, resulting in Nellis becoming a permanent and major base of the Air Force

Taylor is a highly decorated fighter ace, having earned the nation's highest peacetime decoration, the Distinguished Service Medal.
