tion appeared as a veiled threat that the PLO may take matters into its own hands ---militarily. "I need not assure you," he told the Council, "that the successful consummation of the Palestinian struggle for national liberation is not entirely dependent on Security Council or the General Assembly resolutions. "Veto or no veto," he complained "it goes without saying that our national rights in Palestine are inherent; they derive their validity neither from recognition by other powers nor from resolutions...Our national rights are not negotiable."

Arrogant in his demeanor, Khaddoumi showed no indication whatsoever that his PLO has had any change of heart on the question of Israel. In effect, he warned the Security Council that "it is either Israel or us."

He expressed deep thanks to those states, among them Japan and France, who had supported resolution,

LATE NEWS

Daniel P. Moynihan, the most outspoken voice against the Arab/Russian majority, resigned Tuesday as U.S. Ambassador to the U.N. He will be a hard man to follow.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- A pledge of continuing cooperation and friendship between the United States and Israel in the effort to reach a durable and just peace in the Middle East was the theme of Premier Yitzhak Rabin's second official visit to Washington.

But President Ford stressed the need for movement in the Mideast diplomatic process while Rabin was reportedly concerned with American financial support for Israel. These two items were reportedly the center of discussion between Ford and Rabin at three White House meetings, the last one unscheduled. After the first 80-minute meeting, White House Press Secretary Ron Nessen reported that Ford "reaffirmed long-standing American support for the security of Israel" and stressed "the need now is for all sides to search for ways of continuing the process of mutual compromise and comprehension in order to achieve a just and durable peace." Nessen also said that "The President stressed the importance for these talks for developing ideas on how next to move as part of our overall consultations with the parties involved." He repeated his determination to avoid "a hiatus in negotiations."

The theme was also apparent when Ford wel-

L.V. Sun Insults Readers

Two stories in last Saturday's Las Vegas Sun, one a phantasm about an unidentified flying object and men from outer space, the other concerned with publisher Hank Greenspun's attempt to evade repayment of a \$4,000,000 loan, are both so devoid of important facts, they insult the intelligence of any reader over four years old and make a mockery out of journalism.

The UFO garbage, including an artist's conception, in color no less, of another world's crewmen questioning a driver who had stopped to look in his gas tank, was printed in the Page 1 space usually occupied by Greenspun's column that frequently tells of the integrity of the press. Staff writer Jerry Cox by-lined the story, which described the visitors to earth as having squinted eyes, gills, puggish noses and small mouths. The headline proclaimed Curious About Las Vegas...UFO Crewmen Grill Musician.

The story relates that a touring western and country musician, (NOLESS), had to be "coaxed" to identify himself, but swore the story was not a hoax. He claimed two weirdly depicted men from an oblong-shaped space ship, wearing silver and black luminous uniforms, actually walked up to him and spoke for several minutes asking questions about the area. The scene was described as 14 miles southwest of Las Vegas, apparently on a Thursday evening.

A curious reader would like to know the exact spot on what road this alleged incident and unworldly conversation took place. How come the musician's car stalled just in time and started up immediately after? And most important, why were there not other motorists, who most certainly would have stopped, even at a distance, to see strange people from a strange object, walk 200 feet up a road to talk for a few minutes with a fellow earthly human? If one does come forward to corroborate this super-sensible tale, it probably will be a comic driving a Jag.
