WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The driving goal of Israel's policy is that "however difficult the road, however hard the challenge and however complex the process, Israel will strive with all its being to contribute to the peace of the world by pressing ahead with its efforts for peace with the Arab countries," Premier Yitzhak Rabin told a joint session of Congress.

Rabin, the first Israeli Premier to address Congress, also said, "I today declare I am ready to meet with any Arab head of a government at any time and any place for the purpose of peace talks."

But he stressed that the central issue in the Middle East controversy was not territory or the Palestinians but the refusal of the Arab countries to recognize the existence of Israel, Rabin said Israel was ready to negotiate the Palestinian issue "within the geographical and political context of peace with Jordan" which would include Palestinians in the Jordanian delegation. He added that Israel is ready to "give up much and compromise much on territory" in negotiations whose aims are peace and reconciliation.

Recalling that when Egyptian President Anwar Sadat addressed Congress last October he "wisely declared" that there is no substitute person-to-person talks, Rabin said. wish that he would direct these words to me as well as to you, the Congress of the United States. I would then know that the work of true peace - making has finally begun."

Rabin said that the American war for in-dependence in 1776 and Israel's War of In-dependence in 1948 "were both battles of li-beration" that became revolutions because of "the human vision that fired them." He said the "vision and essence of Zionism" is "the principle that the Jewish people should preserve its integrity and restore its national existence in its own homeland, despite the holocause of history." He said the core of the Arab-Israeli conflict "is the refusal of the Arab countries to reconcile themselves to the right of existence of one, small, viable, sovereign, Jewish State in the land of our people's birth; by Jewish

Later in a speech followed by questions and answers at the National Press Club, Rabin said Israel was "willing to take all risks" for real peace but it is "going to stand firm against illusions of a so - called peace." He said that after Israel concluded the Sinai agreement with Egypt it hoped that other countries would follow the diplomatic process, "But we find at least one country -- I mean Syria -- decided to do the opposite." He said "the extreme position of Syria, using the terrorist organization called PLO -- backed by a major power -- not only

PLO -- backed by a major power -- not only blocks the prospects of peace but undermines all that has been agreed upon by the international community for nearly seven years."

Only two hours after Rabin made his remarks about Syria, the State Department said it "recognizes the constructive role the government of Syria is playing" in Lebanon. Department spokesman John Trattner made this comment when asked about a report from Damascus that the U.S. had approved the entry of the Palestine Liberation Army into Lebanon. Trattner tine Liberation Army into Lebanon, Trattner had no direct comment but the U.S. position on Lebanon had always been that the fighting should end "and a political accommodation should end "and a political accommodation acceptable to all Lebanese" be worked out.
