NEW YORK (WNS) -- Premier Yitzhak Rabin said he has achieved "practical results" in his talks with President Ford and members of the

Administration and Congress in Washington.
"I came encouraged from my meetings in Washington," he told 1500 local Jewish community leaders attending a United Jewish munity leaders attending a United Jewish Appeal - Federation of Jewish Philanthropies Joint Campaign dinner here. "I found there understanding and readiness" by the Administration and Congress to continue to support Israel and the cause of peace in the Middle East. He said he also found a willingness to provide Israel with financial aid to meet its military needs.

Later speaking to some 300 Jewish leaders from across the country at a briefing spon-sored by the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, Rabin said that while Israel did not get all that it had asked for, his experience has been that it takes several steps "and we get what we want in the long run" Rabin also stressed that there is no difference between the U.S. and Israel on the question of the Palestine Liberation Organization and of a Palestinian state. He said that as a result of his talks he believes that the U.S. prefers that the Palestinian issue be settled in negotiations between Israel and Jordan,

In his 15 - minute talk to the UJA-FJP dinner, Rabin dwelt on the "lessons" of the Lebanese conflict. He said the civil war there

# Newsman Suggests Lawbreak

When Valley Times columnist Dick Odessky advocated breaking the laws of the land by sug-gesting police squad cars be parked in front of Las Vegas massage parlors to discourage business, he violated one of the fundamental func-tions of the free American press - - - to safeguard the public against over-zealous officials, who take the law in their own hands.

In addition, with the local crime rate going over 1000 - a - month, and Sheriff Ralph Lamb seeking an additional 98 lawmen to cope with the rising menace, Odessky's view is positively asinine in the matter of priorities for law enforcement. But this is not the point. The main issue is the disconsolation of a newspaperman injecting his own slant seeking to circumvent the law as it stands, to force people to do as he would like against their own wishes,

It has always been our contention that each of us, including editorial commentators, has every right to his opinions and his acts, provid-ing they are legal and do not breach upon others. We do not believe in any form, type or manner of censorship. While we personally conform to certain accepted rules of procedure, dress and personal habits, in no way would we point a finger at a fellow-man with contrary inhibitions.

Odessky feels otherwise, He says, Los

Angeles cops, who are HAMPERED by the same type of laws which allow massage operators to thrive in Las Vegas, have found a way to make life miserable for the owners. Dick suggests

Vegas police use the same tactics.

Here we have an interesting new twist on the philosophy of law enforcement, laws that HAMPER policemen. We always thought the sole, main and only purpose of a policeman was to uphold and enforce the laws, not look to circumvate them. We never heard of a law that HAMPERS policemen. Apparently, the only HAMPERING being committed is against blue noses.

Odessky does not favor massage parlors, Neither do we. If they should be disallowed by law, you'll never hear a peep of protest out of us. But we will protest to the high heavens against anyone who wants to clamp his own narrow, selfish, egocentricities on the rights of others.

It is somewhat paradoxical that Odessky, who made a living for years as publicity man for the Stardust Lido show, one of the most outstanding, nudi, bare-breast of erings on the (Continued on Page 4)
