Rabin also told the Knesset that in his talks in Washington it was agreed to attempt to reconvene the Geneva conference while at the same time explore other peacemaking initiatives. He said there was also agreement between the U.S. and Israel on not recognizing the Palestine Liberation Organization.

Later speaking before the Israel-American Friendship Society Rabin said that U.S. - Israel friendship could weather transient disagreements because both nations shared basic common values that bound them together, Noting a common dedication to democracy, a common Biblical heritage and the fact that both the U.S. and Israel were immigrant societies, Rabin said that travelling across the U.S. he felt that "regardless of what was written in the press" there was deep sympathy and understanding and readiness by the American people to work together with Israel.

He urged Israelis not to take the U.S. for nted. "Even when there are disagreements granted. -- and we don't have to accept everything, some-times we have to be stubborn." Rabin stressed "let us not say things which bring needless consequences to the relationship." He noted consequences to the relationship.
