

## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The Senate by a 60-30 vote adopted a \$3.54 billion foreign military aid authorization bill that clamps down on countries that violate human rights including the Arab boycott.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Prof. Shlomo Avineri, dean of Hebrew University's political science faculty, has been approved by the Cabinet as the new Director General of the Foreign Ministry, effective April 1st.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The violent demonstrations by East Jerusalem Arab youths against the recent decision by a Jerusalem magistrate that would allow Jewish prayer on the Temple Mount in the Old City has spread to the West Bank.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The government in its continuing efforts to stop leaks to the press is limiting the number of people who can attend the Cabinet meetings.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- "Aliya is the most important, most serious imperative in our lives," Yosef Almog, chairman of the World Zionist Organization and acting chairman of the Jewish Agency, told the seventh annual convention of the Association of Americans and Canadians for Aliya.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- "Israel has seven lean years ahead with peace just a dim hope," Uri Ben-Ari, Israel's Consul-General in New York told the mid-winter conference of Hadassah. But he said Israel will come through because of "Jewish power" which is based not on military might but on faith and commitment, psychological toughness, willingness to sacrifice to face hardships in building a nation and the solidarity of the Jewish people.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The 800 delegates from Canada and 300 Canadian Olim who are participating in the fourth annual Canadian Zionist Federation convention here are taking pride in the fact that this is the first overseas Zionist convention to be held here since the World Jewish Solidarity Conference last year declared 1976 a year of identity with Israel. Philip Givens, of Toronto, was reelected CZF president.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Polish government has been asked to make full payment of all pensions and other insurance claims to Polish Jewish survivors of the Holocaust now living outside Poland. The request was made by the American Federation of Polish Jews in a memorandum presented to Witold Tromcynsky, the Polish Ambassador in Washington.

SINAI (WNS) -- The Israeli army began its final evacuation in the Sinai with a pullback from the Budapest stronghold.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The people of Israel have sent 40,000 pounds of relief supplies to the earthquake-stricken people of Guatemala.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- West Bank Arab women will be voting for the first time in the municipal elections to be held in Judea and Samaria in April.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Jerusalem Post has reported "well informed West Bank sources" as saying that Jordan and Syria are moving toward establishing a federation called the "United Arab State."

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (WNS) -- The Israel Histadrut Foundation ended its 10th annual Economic Conference by setting a new goal of \$50 million.

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- Correspondents here at the UN appeared pleased to learn that William Warren Scranton, President Ford's choice for the post of American Ambassador to the world organization, had indicated quite clearly that, if confirmed by the Senate, he would follow in the footsteps of Daniel Patrick Moynihan in standing up to the enemies of mankind in this world body.

LOD (WUP) -- Israel's Aircraft Industries expect foreign sales to approach \$130 million this year, about four times its 1975 exports.

NEW YORK -- Dr. Joe D. Seger, Visiting Research Professor at Hebrew Union College and Skirball Museum in Los Angeles, has been appointed scholar in residence at the School of Fine Arts of the University of Nebraska at Omaha. The appointment was made possible by a grant from a recently established program to stimulate Jewish cultural activities in small and intermediate-size communities.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The style of Sabbath and holiday services among American Jewish college students is being changed by the feminist movement, according to a report by the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations.
