ISAIAH ON UN WALL

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- ISAIAH the great Hebrew Prophet finally got his name inscribed under his famous Peace Message on the huge Wall facing the United Nations -- the site of hundreds of demonstrations by various groups challenging the world organization to act on behalf

of justice for oppressed people around the globe. It took the dynamic action of one individual through a persistent campaign to get the City of New York under Mayor Beame to give due credit to the Author of the world famous peace nassage which reads. passage which reads:

passage which reads: "And they shall beat their swords into Plow-shares, and their spears into pruning-hooks. Nation shall not lift up Sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more." Previous City Administrations under Mayors Wagner, and Lindsay, had been appealed to on

Wagner and Lindsay had been appealed to on several occasions to have the name ISAIAH inscribed under this passage -- but no action was taken

But Sam Brown, a former executive director of the New Jersey region of the American Jewish Congress and currently directing tours in Congress and currently directing tours in greater New York and Philadelphia for Jewish groups to historic Jewish sites of interest, succeeded in accomplishing what others had failed to do. Based in Miami, Florida, --where is is active as a counsellor of the Jewish Vocation Service in the placement of jobs for Russian Jews -- Sam Brown flies to New York each week to conduct his tours to the many historic Jewish sites in and around the Metropolitan region.

Brown's campaign involved some fund-raising necessary for the inscription and Gab. Cohen of the National Jewish Post helped in this ef-fort. More than six hundred dollars was raised

through the Post and the work was started, On Sunday, December 7, a unique ceremony was held at the Wall celebrating the event. A group of some fifty people attended. Standing

A young tlergyman I know has worked out a reply to those who say they don't care for organized religion. So many people have told him they don't need organized religion that he quips. "Welt, then you'll like our church. It's

quips. "Weil, then you'll like our church. It's completely disorganized." People often say they don't need a sanctuary for worship because they can pray privately. Or they say they can extol God when they see a lovely sunrise or sunset or a beautiful land-scape or seascape.

scape or seascape. It is true, my friends, that God can be appre-ciated anywhere, for He is everywhere. One can not only sense the nearness of God in places of beauty. You can feel the promptings of God in areas of squalor and ugliness, for when you are in a slum or when you see adversity you are in a slum or when you see adversity, you can virtually hear the still, small voice of the Lord urging you to alleviate the predicament of those in need.

But this need not be an either-or situation. It's both-and. You can experience God in nature and in human nature, but that doesn't mean that you should avoid organized worship. In a sanc-tuary, with fellow worshippers nearby and with lovely music, one can feel one's soul lifted up. This effect is strikingly established in the Psalm in your Bible, where the writes first users in your Bible, where the writer first uses those words, the power and the glory. Writes the Psalmist: "So have I looked for Thee in the Psaimist: "So have I looked for Thee in the sanctuary, to behold Thy power and Thy glory." And what happens to the Psalmist who spends some time in the house of worship? His next words are rhapsolic. He cries out: "For Thy loving-kindness is better than life...My lips shall praise Thee...So will I bless Thee as long as I live."

If any good cause is to be effective, it must be organized. So too with devoutness. Re-read Psalm 63, and see if it doesn't move you. Perit'll move you to a house of worship this weekend. I hope so.

The complete Isaiah passage read out by Rabbi Block is worth recording, since it is a prophecy pointing to the fact that eventually all mankind will look towards a reborn Israel and Zion for world peace and true knowledge: "And it shall come to pass in the end of days, that the Mountain of the Lord's House shall be established as the top of the mountains. And it shall be exalted above the hills; and all nations shall flow unto it. And many peoples shall go and say: 'Come ye, and let us go up to the Mountain of the Lord, to the House of the God of Jacob; and He will teach us of His ways, God of Jacob; and He will teach us of His ways, and we will walk in His paths. "For out of Zion shall go forth Torah, and

"For out of Zion shall go forth lorah, and the Word of the Lord from Jerusalem. And He will judge between the nations, and shall decide for many peoples. And they will beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks. Nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore." (Isaiah 2: 2-4).
