ALL ABOUT U.S.Y.



Tikum Olam is the Tzedakah (Charity) fund of United Synagogue Youth. As the only charity project of U.S.Y., many urgent requests are received for aid from institutions all over the world.

The 1975-1976 goal of a quarter of a million dollars will be achieved by U.S.Y. chapters nationwide.

Whether you are a member or not you can join the family project, which is sitting aside a canister in your home and putting money in it before lighting the Shabbat candles. Or you can make a special donation on a Simcha (happy occasion).

Here is how the money from Tikum Olam is distributed. Thirty percent goes to assist the development of Conservative Jewish programs in Israel, to provide educational materials about Jewish concepts of "charities." Another 30% goes to scholarships enabling U.S.Y.ers to participate in U.S.Y. summer programs, including visiting and experiencing life in Israel and other Jew-

ish communities in North America, Europe and Russia. The remaining 40% goes to Jewish institutions in need throughout the world, including orphanages, schools and hospitals.

The year 1976 marks the 16th annual U.S.Y. Wheels program, cross country both ways from New York to California and vice versa. Forty three U.S.Y.ers and four advisors travel on each bus cross continent seeing the awesome beauty of the U.S. and Canada. The groups leave from east and west on Monday, June 28 and return 46 days later on August 12. I wish I were going, but I truly hope they have a great time.
