

RABIN ACCUSES FORD

decision on the part of President Sadat to ease tensions in the area and to move it toward peace," Kissinger said.

Meanwhile, another issue developed over a report that Sadat in a press conference in Kuwait said that he had a "secret" agreement with the U.S. that Israel would not attack Syria and that the Palestinians would participate in a Middle East settlement.

Senate Majority leader Mike Mansfield (D.Mont) immediately called for an investigation since Kissinger had told the Senate Foreign Relations Committee last October that it had been given all the secret undertakings by the U.S. in the Israeli-Egyptian accord on the Sinai. Questioned about Sadat's statement by the House Committee, Kissinger said that "all commitments made by the U.S. with respect to the Sinai were submitted to the committee and other appropriate committees and the record is before you." The State Department had also said earlier that everything had been presented to Congress.

Earlier the Rabin government had sought to stress that Egypt was striving to improve relations in the area. Rabin told the Labor Alignment Executive in the Knesset that it was "an important development" of "great significance" that Sadat has reportedly warned Syria that if Syria initiated a war against Israel, Egypt would not be drawn into it. Defense Minister Shimon Peres told the Knesset that all indications pointed to a desire by the Egyptian government to pursue "the political option" rather than war and concentrate on revitalizing Egypt's staggering economy.

SYRIA TO ASK UN TO CONTROL WEST BANK, GAZA

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- All indications here at the UN point to the fact that Syria is expected to ask for a high price on the issue of the renewal of UNDOF which mandate expires in May.

Secretariat officials are worried. They recall that on the very eve of the previous extension Syria had agreed to the renewal on condition that the PLO be seated and recognized in the Security Council.

There is some talk now in the corridors here that Damascus, in deference to the PLO, might demand that the West Bank

and the Gaza Strip be placed under UN "Auspices."

MAJORITY UN FORCES IN SINAI ANTI-ISRAEL

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- Four out of seven UNEF units in the enlarged Sinai buffer zone come from states that are out-and-out anti-Israeli. These are Indonesia, Senegal, Ghana and Poland whose governments maintain no diplomatic relations with Israel.

The three others are Finland, Sweden and Canada.

The redeployment of forces totalling some 4,530 men and women in the new buffer zone covering an area of more than 4,000 kilometers was completed last week under the second Sinai disengagement agree-

ment which gave to Egypt 89 additional square miles and which brought some 200 American technicians to monitor the Gidi and Mitla passes.

The Sinai accord bitterly opposed by Syria and the PLO, contained a clause which practically isolated Egypt from the radical Arab states. This clause stated that "the two countries agree that the conflict between them and in the Middle East shall not be resolved by military force but by peaceful means."

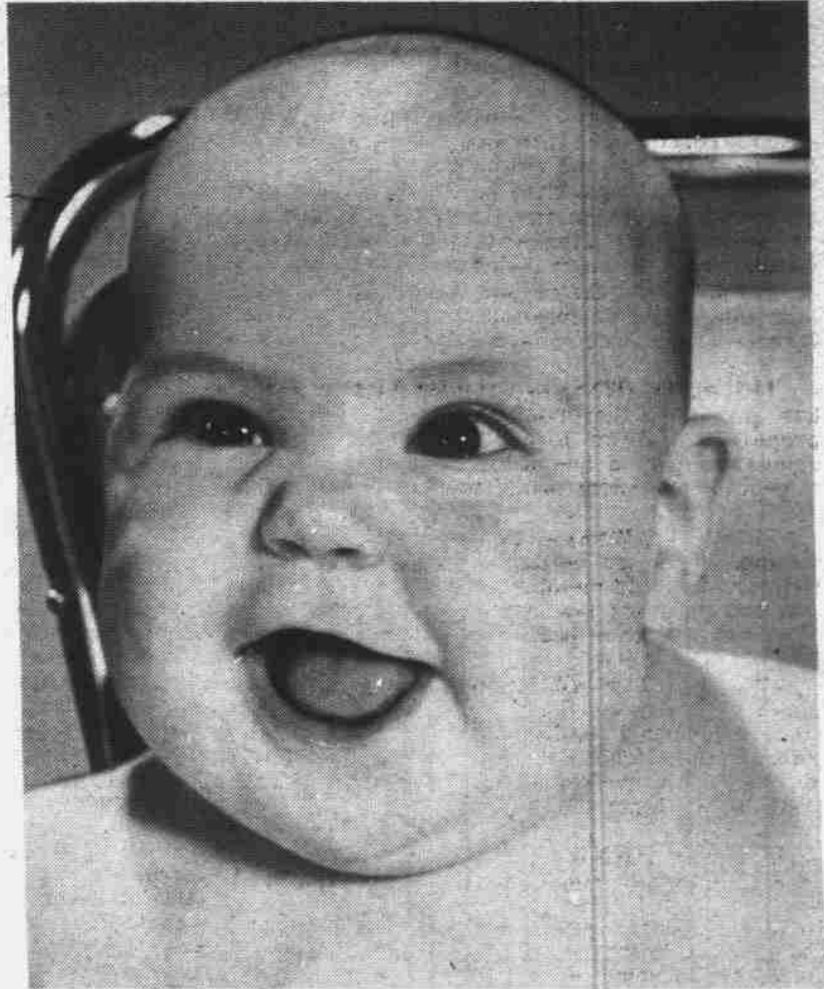
NO ISRAELI CONCESSIONS ON GOLAN HGTS.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel will not make concessions to keep the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF) on the Golan Heights when its mandate expires May 31.

The spokesman made it clear that Israel considers UNDOF's continued presence "an inseparable part of the disengagement agreement between Israel and Syria" which was signed in 1974. "No blackmail efforts will force Israel to make any commitment in advance."

He was apparently referring to the situation last November 30, when Syria agreed to a six-month extension of UNDOF only after the UN Security Council acceded to the demands of Damascus to hold a special debate on the Middle East with the participation of the PLO.

Meanwhile, Defense Minister Shimon Peres told the Canadian Zionist Federation convention here that the expiration date of the UNDOF mandate is the next danger point in the Middle East conflict. He said Syria will agree to an extension only if it is confronted with a strong Israel. He said if Syria chooses a military clash it will find "a well-prepared Israeli army."
