ISRAELI DOVE OUTLINES PEACE INITIATIVE

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Arye Eliav, a leading Israeli dove and former Secretary General of the Labor Party, has urged Israel to make a "peace initiative consisting of a general declaration of

what Israel considers to constitute a long-term comprehensive settlement of all the outstanding problems between Israel and its Arab neighbors."

Eliav, who left the Labor Party and is now one of two-member Independent Socialist Party in the Knesset, told a press conference Israel should declare that "in exchange for full peace... Israel would be willing to withdraw from the territories occupied in the 1967 war with mutually agreed upon adjustments in the final border lines." He said Israel should "clarify that it is not opposed to the rights of the Palestinians to self-determination in a state of their own -- to be established alongside Israel in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip."

Eliav, who is on a tour of the United States sponsored by B'etra, a leftwing group on whose advisory board he serves,

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- A resolution of the United Nations Security Council which deplored Israeli policies in Jerusalem and the administered areas was vetoed by the United States.

The vote on the resolution followed four days of discussions in which Israel and the Palestine Liberation Organization engaged in direct debate for the first time. The 14 to one vote followed a session called by Libya and Pakistan, the Islamic members of the Council, over the unrest which has flared in East Jerusalem and the West Bank in recent weeks.

William M. Scranton, the new U.S. Ambassador to the UN, called the resolution unbalanced. The draft resolution had been worked out by third world members of the Council in talks with Arab and other Islamic countries, and with the Communist powers. The sponsors were, Benin, Guyana, Panama, Pakistan and Tanzania. Also voting for it were Libya, Britain, China, France, Italy, Japan, Rumania, the Soviet Union and Sweden.

The resolution deplored Israel's failure to put a stop to actions and policies tending to change the status of the city of Jerusalem. It called on Israel to refrain from actions against Arab residents of the administered territories, to respect the inviolability of the holy places, and stop
