

# JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Senator Henry M. Jackson announced that he has joined with Senator Abraham Ribicoff (D. Conn.) and others in a new legislative effort to deny certain tax benefits to U.S. firms which collaborate with the Arab boycott of Israel.

NEW YORK -- A delegation of the World Sephardi Federation was given an audience by the new King of Spain Juan Carlos I, in Madrid.

CINCINNATI -- Jewish scholar and new testament specialist, Dr. Samuel Sandmel, Professor of Bible and Hellenistic Literature at Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion has called for increased communications between Jewish and Christian academics as an essential avenue to continue "amity, understanding and mutual regard" between the faith groups.

NEW YORK (WUP) -- A New York Times dispatch from Paris dated March 22, revealed that France has agreed to build a nuclear power plant in Libya.

AHSDOD, (WUP) -- The population of this fast - growing Mediterranean port has hit the 55,000 mark Mayor Zvi Zilker announced at a recent meeting of the Israeli Engineering Club.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel is building an electronic early warning system from Mt. Hermon on the Golan Heights to points south of Jerusalem, Defense Minister Shimon Peres told the Engineers Club here.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Bulldozers and earth-movers of the Jewish National Fund are working on the development of Yamit, a town being built on the southern tip of the Gaza Strip, and on an industrial park north of the town. There are presently 58 families living in Yamit, 20 from the United States, 20 from the Soviet Union and 18 Israelis.

LONDON (WNS) -- Gen. Ezer Weizman, former commander of the Israel Air Force, announcing that he will return to active Herut politics, strongly attacked the leadership of Premier Yitzhak Rabin as "gray, divided and uncharismatic."

ZOA HOUSE, NEW YORK -- Kfar Silver 20th Anniversary celebrations, a discussion on "The Zionist Movement -- Israel and U.S. Policy in the Middle East," a United States Bicentennial celebration, a reception with Israel political leaders, and a traveling Jerusalem Seminar are just a few of the programs highlights of the Zionist Organization of America "Extraordinary Leadership Study Mission and National Executive Committee Meeting" scheduled to be held in Israel from May 19th to 27th, 1976.

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The Jewish War Veterans of U.S.A. has vehemently protested the contemplated military supply relationship with Egypt, starting with six Hercules C-120 military transport planes.

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Yosef Tekoah, Israel's former Ambassador to the United Nations and a long time Israel career diplomat spoke before the Zionist Organization of America National Executive Committee Meeting and categorically rejected the idea of any Israeli talks with the PLO and any notion of a second Palestine State, in addition to what he termed the Arab-Palestine State of Jordan.
