### RELIGIOUS PLURALISM

NEW YORK -- Citing the "terrible fratricidal civil war in Lebanon as "the newest of what happens when religious hatred is allowed to fester and there exists no respect for religious pluralism," the President of the National Conference of Christians and Jews called for the eradication of the "evils of intolerance, injustice and oppression."

Dr. David Hyratt, in a statement issued for the Passover-Easter holy days, stressed the need for mankind to establish "amity, love and peace among ourselves."

### INSIDE ISRAEL

A major crisis in relations between Israel and the United States was averted only when a veto was cast in the UN Security Council. Israel's Foreign Minister, Yigal Allon, made it clear that he crisis would have been "big and far-reaching." The background was a speech by William Scranton, the new American UN Ambassador, in which he contended that steps taken in Jerusalem (unification of the city after the 1967 War) were in disregard of international law. Scranton also spoke out strongly against the establishment of settlements

### KISSINGER TELLS CONGRESS NO PLANES WOULD BE SLAP IN SADAT'S FACE

WASH. (WNS) -- Secretary of State

Henry A. Kissinger has declared that if Congress refuses to allow the United States to sell to Egypt six C-130 transport planes it "would be a slap in the face" for Egyptian President Anwar Sadat.

Kissinger told the House International Relations Committee that it was in the national interest to end the 20-year American arms embargo to Egypt because it would demonstrate that an Arab country "on a road of moderation is better for its people." He noted that if Congress refused to approve the deal so close after Egypt's abrogation of its friendship treaty with the Soviet Union it "would have very serious consequences because of the symbolism that

it involves." Meanwhile, the National Jewish Welfare Board adopted a resolution at its biennial convention in New Orleans deploring the sale of the planes and saying "it would be wiser to develop relations with Egypt through economic rather than military means."

### Passover Marvel

(The following information was gathered from the Columbia Encyclopedia, The Story of Pesach published by a commercial matzoth company, and Tolstoi.)

How much can be added to a story that has been commemorated and told in every Jewish family during the annual Seder? True, each year the ceremonial portion of the traditional party dwindles, while the menu for the feast keeps expanding in proportion to the new products that hit the market, labeled Kosher for Passover. The soup-to-nuts Seder now includes canned soups, frozen meats, all flavors of soda pop, many kinds of candy and after-dinner mints - all legitimately in keeping with Passover dietary laws, and stylish.

But the story persists, nevertheless.

It had its inception long before Moses, when Jacob's son Joseph, was sold into slavery by his brothers. Joe, with his Jewish "kup" interpreted a dream of the king Pharaoh which saved Egypt from starvation. All Joe did was store up grain during the years of plenty for food during the years of starvation.

Generations later, another Pharaoh, panicked by interpretation of a nightmare, ordered all
