HISTORIC CATHOLIC-JEWISH MEETING COMBATS ANTI-SEMITISM

The fifth annual meeting of the International Catholic - Jewish Liaison Committee ended three days of talks in Jerusalem, Israel on March 3rd by unanimously expressing its "profound concern over the campaign to defame the State of Israel and the Jewish people and isolate them from the International community."

A statement issued in Jerusalem by a group comprised of 12 Catholics representing the Vatican and 17 Jews representing five Jewish organizations, noted "with satisfaction the repudiation by various authorities of the Catholic Church of the resolution of the General Assembly of the United Nations equating Zionism with racism." The special significance attached to the fact that the Vatican agreed to the meeting in the Holy City was reflected in the closing statement signed by all participants expressing "deep joy over the historical and religious significance of the fact that the meeting took place for the first time in the holy city of Jerusalem." The main focus of the consultation was a Jewish and Catholic assessment of major developments in Catholic - Jewish relations since the issuance of the Second Vation Declaration (Nostra Actate) in 1965.

(Nostra Aetate) in 1965. Rabbi Henry Slegman, executive vice president of the Synagogue Council of America, in a paper expressing his personal views charted the progress represented by the Vatican Guidelines issued in January, 1975, ten years after Nostra Aetate. The Guidelines are the first official document to call for the study of Judaism and an understanding of the Jewish faith in light of Judaism's own self-understanding. According to Rabbi Siegman, before a serious dialogue between Catholics and Jews can take place, the Catholic Church must first come to terms with its own responsibility for anti-Semitism.

"Despite the problem of anti-Semitism" said Rabbi Siegman, the Guidelines represent a major advance over Nostra Actate, because they are the first Catholic document on the highest level of authority which "view Judaism as a rich and vital religious movement and seeks a living link with It. The Vatican Guidelines reflect a new reality; the relations of the Catholic Church and the Jewish people -- for all of their remaining complexity and potential for conflict -- have changed fundamentally. We perceive one another and are able to talk to one another in ways that we re utterly inconceivable only a generation ago."
