

## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK (LNS) -- A year of intensive activity to foster and further Jewish Torah education in all parts of the world was proclaimed here by the Lubavitcher Rebbe.

NEW YORK -- Under a grant from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration of the United States Department of Justice, the National Council of Jewish Women will sponsor a 3-day Symposium on Status Offenders to be held May 17-19, 1976 at the National 4-H Foundation Center in Washington.

NEW YORK, N.Y. -- Without mentioning or favoring any of the presidential candidates, an editorial in the May issue of REFORM JUDAISM, the official publication of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, warns Jews against the exploitation by politicians of legitimate Jewish emotions about Israel and Soviet Jewry.

NEW YORK -- Bowie Kuhn, Howard Cosell, Cedric Tallis, Dave DeBusschere, Charles Feeney, John Galbreath, and Frank Gifford are among the sports celebrities who will attend the first annual Sports Torch of Learning Dinner in honor of Gabe Paul, New York Yankees President, on Monday, May 10, at the New York Hilton. A living testimonial to the eleven Israeli Olympic athletes who died at the hands of terrorists at the 1972 Olympics in Munich, proceeds will benefit students at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Two Israeli policemen were killed and four others injured while dismantling a bomb planted by terrorists on B'nai B'rith Street in the center of Jerusalem.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Some 40 Canadian immigrants to Israel are testifying before a three-man commission appointed by the Zionist Organization of Canada on the difficulties experienced by Canadian olim in Israel.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- There are enough votes in the Knesset to defeat any move to remove the Gush Emunim squatters from Kadum in Samaria, Herut leader Menachem Beigin told a meeting of the party's central committee. He said he has a list of 62 MKs opposed to the evacuation.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Prof. Alexander Luntz, the noted Soviet mathematician, who recently emigrated to Israel, blames the KGB for the death of Col. Yefim Davidovich in Minsk. Davidovich, a Red Army hero, died several weeks after suffering his fifth heart attack at the age of 54. "There are many ways to kill people," Luntz said. "The KGB uses all of them. Everybody should know that Col. Yefim Davidovich was killed by the KGB." Luntz made his remarks at a memorial service held in front of the Soviet Mission to the United Nations.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Siamese twin girls, joined at the chest and stomach, died three days after they were born at Hadassah Hospital.

MELBOURNE (WNS) -- Eddie Zananiri, vice-president of the General Union of Palestinian Students, which is affiliated with the Palestine Liberation Organization, was denied entry by the Australian government.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- In a brief ceremony the original Hadassah Hospital on Mt. Scopus was re-opened and the first 25 patients received.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Maj. Yekutiel Adam, chief of the general staff branch at General Headquarters, sees the Israeli army facing a deteriorating security situation and a reduced military budget during the 1976-77 fiscal year.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A group of Israeli soldiers were fired upon as they were driving by Herod's Gate in the Old City of Jerusalem.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Speakers at a service at Temple Emanu-El commemorating the 33rd anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising declared that the murder by the Nazis of six million Jews must not be forgotten in order to prevent a new Holocaust.

NEW YORK -- Thousands of Jews overseas in Italy, Rumania, Austria, Moslem lands and elsewhere, including about 1,000 Russian Jewish transmigrants en route to countries other than Israel, took part in seders sponsored and funded completely or in part by the Joint Distribution Committee.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Richard Rosenbaum, chairman of New York State's Republican Party, has pledged to introduce a strong pro-Israel plank in the Republican Party's platform at its national convention in August.
