ceive \$375 million to meet its defense needs but no other country would receive supplemental funds. Case revealed the compromise after meeting privately with Ford.

Meanwhile, Ford indicated he might veto the entire foreign aid bill during a meeting with the Republican Congressional leadership. Rep. Robert Michel (R, Ill.) told reporters that the President had "grave concerns" about the authorization bill. He said the President believes the bill limits the President's authority on matters which he feels are his prerogative, not that of Congress.

Ford reportedly objected to the Congressional veto of military sales to foreign countries that exceed \$25 million; Congressional veto of transfer of American weapons by a foreign power to a third country; and the anti-discrimination provisions that would cut off U.S. aid to a country that discriminates against Americans.

RABIN: SEARCH FOR PEACE "SUPREME PRIORITY"

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Yitzhak Rabin has declared that "the search for peace" is "the supreme priority" as Jews in Israel and throughout the world mark the 28th anniversary of the independence of the State of Israel.

He said Israel's independence "draws a line between past survival by chance and future existence by self-will; or being helplessly controlled by events and controlling events by our own choice, means and purpose." Rabin, in his Independence Day message, said after the "major challenge" of seeking peace, Israel must meet the need for strengthening its defense, improving its economy, closing the social gap and strengthening

the ties between Israel and the Jewish people.

"Our future like our past is one," Rabin declared. "It must be forged even stronger and even deeper through a new priority for Jewish education... through a new commitment to aliya. And it must be reflected in closed ties of intimacy through volunteer efforts in Israel, visits to Israel in unprecedented numbers, the sharing of material means, public solidarity and an ever meaningful dialogue of thinking." Rabin also urged help for "the remnants of (Jewish) communities in Arab countries where they are being held hostage and the great Jewish community of the Soviet Union."
