Humphrey and former Defense Secretary James Schlesinger both accused the United States of putting undue pressure on Israel. Their remarks were made in speeches to the 17th annual policy conference of the American-Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC).

Humphrey charged that the Ford Administration has taken steps which are eroding the historical bonds between Israel and the U.S. He urged Ford and Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger "to act more prudently in the execution of American policy toward Israel." He said the Administration "simply does not understand that actions which are perceived to weaken the American commitment to Israel will not bring

the American commitment to Israel will not bring peace to the Middle East. They can only bring confusion and postponement of peace."

Schlesinger said "it is improper-pernicious-to blame the failure to achieve a settlement (in the Mideast) on the one nation prepared to accept a settlement," an obvious allusion to the Administration's open criticism of Israel's alleged failure to offer initiatives for peace. "Momentum is fine," Schlesinger said.

"The question is momentum toward what. To a just and comprehensive settlement? To a reduction or the end of terrorism? To the reduction or the end of terrorism? To the recognition of state entities?" He said to place the blame on Israel "is an improper judgment." The former Defense Secretary stressed that "even - handedness is different from forcing either side into concessions. If we heard it correctly during services at Temple Beth Sholom last Friday -- that the Arab countries will be looking for Israel to save them from the Russians -- it is probably the best news out of the Mideast since Israel became a nation in 1948.

Because if it is truly a circumstance which will come about in the future, it means the Arabs, at long last, will realize that Israel is a friendly neighbor ready and willing to serve the best interests of the area. It will mean also a lessening and ending of the hostility towards the Jewish State. dency than Gerald Ford.

We are thoroughly disillusioned by the broken promises of Ford and his Secretary of State Kissinger. All their words of assurance they will not let Israel down, is not in keeping with their actions of support for Egypt, indifference for Lebanon pressure on the Jewish difference for Lebanon, pressure on the Jewish state and withholding of aid.

So we sought out and spoke with Sen. Paul Laxalt, chairman of national citizens committee for Reagan. We found that Reagan was awarded the Medal of Valor of the State of Israel in 1971. He also received the National Humanitarian Award from National Conference of Christians and Jews.

Reagan is a severe critic of "detente" as a one-way street, just as we are. Reagan accused Kissinger of being more concerned with "detente" than the pouring of Russian with "detente" than the pouring of Russian arms to Egypt to launch a surprise attack against Israel in 1973.

Reagan advocates a peaceful settlement in the Middle East, with a warning that the future of Israel must be insured.
