LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE FORD'S MESSAGE TO JEWS

NEW YORK (WNS) Jews and non-Jews expressed their support of the struggle of Soviet Jewry to emi-grate to Israel with grate 150,000 marchsome ing down Fifth avenue as thousands as other supporters lined the parade route.

The march, spon-sored by the Greater New York Conference on Soviet Jewry as part of the nationwide "Solidarity Sunday for Soviet Jewry," ended at Dag with a rally Hammarsk old Plaza from the across United Nations. Other demonstrations were held across the country under the auspices of the National Conference on Soviet Jewry. Eugene Gold, chairman of the the GNYCSJ, called the march a "tremendous gathering of Jews and non-Jews, Blacks and White'' who were expressing their opposition to Soviet oppression of Jews. The carried marchers signs expressing "Solidarity with Soviet expressing Jewry," and saying such things as "Their Fight is Our Fight," "Let My People Go," "We shall not Silenced," and be we shall not be Silenced," and "Let My Fellow Jews Emi-grate." The marchers, young and old, some of them pushing

baby carriages, were mostly quiet although some sang Hebrew songs or shouted slogans.

Ford was read to the rally along with mes-sages from Cardinal Cooke and AFL - CIO president George president Members of Meany. the New York delegation in the House of Representatives participated in the March, Earlier the House approved a resolution urging the Soviet Union remove all obstacto les to free emigration of Soviet Jews and others who wish to live in other countries. The resolution, introduced by Rep. Bella Abzug (D-L, NY) and co-sponsored by 26 other New York Congressmen, was in conjunction with "Solidarity Sunday.

Jewry was also dis-cussed by Israeli Am-bassador Chaim Herzog when he reminded the United Nations Economic and Social that the Committee Soviet Union signed the Helsinki Declaration calling for the reunification of families. "I am sorry to report that since the signing of that agreement there has been a marked deterioration in the

THE WHITE HOUSE ASHINGTON

April 27, 1976

It is a pleasure for me to greet the fellow Americans who are meeting on this Solidarity Sunday for Soviet Jewry to reaffirm their commitment to human dignity and fundamental rights.

Our nation was founded on the principle that certain rights were inalienable. These rights -- to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness -- have never been more dear. What our forefathers had the wis-dom to proclaim 200 years ago, we still deeply believe today. It is particularly appropriate, therefore, that in this Bicentennial year Americans everywhere rededicate themselves to the principles of human rights on which the nation was founded.

As I said four and a half years ago in New York at a similar meeting: Let our American values demonstrate to the peoples of the world that we Americans have not changed in our devotion to the freedom and brotherhood of man under the fatherhood of God.

The American people have long sought to promote respect for fundamental human rights, including the right of emigration. I assure you today that the United States Government will continue to promote the principles contained in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, both in appropriate international forums and in our exchanges with other governments.

It is in this spirit that I convey my best wishes to you who have assembled in New York today on behalf of human rights and liberty.
