
## HOWARD RUSK TO ADDRESS HADASSAH DEDICATION IN ISRAEL JUNE 12 TO 28

Visitors from the U.S. and Europe are expected in Jerusalem for the two-week Dedication - Conference of the Daniel and Florence Guggenheim Rehabilitation Pavilion at the Hadassah University Hospital, Mount Scopus and of the Siegfried and Irma Ullmann Building for and Allied Diseases on the campus of the Hadassah - Hebrew University Medical Center in Ein Karem.

Dr. Howard Rusk, world authority in rehabi-litation medicine will be the major speaker on June 15 at the Rehabilitation Pavilion, which has been built at a cost of seven million dollars, as part of the newly reopened Mount Scopus hospital. Axel Springer, the publisher, whose foundation has made a contribution to the center,

foundation has made a contribution to the center, will come from West Berlin.

Faye L. Schenk, Hadassah Medical Organization chairman says, "It was because of the recognition of the importance of rehabilitation in modern society that Hadassah decided to allocate the entire eastern wing of the revived hospital on Mount Scopus to the Guggenheim Rehabilitation Pavilion, with 49 beds for inpatients, 12 beds for intensive care, a gymnasium with a glorious view of the Dead Sea, a therapeutic pool, 'quiet' workrooms, 'noisy' workrooms, treatment rooms with the most sophisticated equipment for ultrasonic and shortwave treatment and electrotherapy. Cardiac wave treatment and electrotherapy. Cardiac patients can be followed on cardiac evaluation equipment, including telemetry, which enables the heart activity to be measured from afar over long periods of time. Special respiratory evaluation and diagnosis are available. A private park allows the patients to relax or participate in organized sport activities, while those who need it, are being monitored from the building. building.

cal Center at Ein Karem will be given to other medical departments. The big out - patient clinic will continue its activities at Ein Karem and a smaller out-patient clinic on Mount Sco-pus will mainly serve for follow - up of patients previously hospitalized.

The Department will have a staff of 10 physicians, 19 psysiotherapists, 15 occupational therapists, clinical and vocational psycholo-

therapists, clinical and vocational psychologists, social workers and a sports trainer. The Siegfried and Irma Ullmanh Building for Cancer and Allied Diseases will be dedicated on Sunday, June 27. This will be the largest such facility between Paris and Tokyo. There will be a two - day "International Symposium on Malignant Neoplastic Diseases," June 28 and 29, under the joint auspices of the Israel Academy of Sciences and Humanities, the Hadassah Medical Organization and the Habraw University ssah Medical Organization and the Hebrew Univssan Medical Organization and the Hebrew University - Hadassah Medical School; and a seminar
on June 26 for laymen on the tour, "Cancer Can
Be Cured," organized by Professor G. Izak.

Israel, addresses by Golda Meir, Prime Minister
Yitzhak Rabin, and receptions by Mrs. Rabin,
