Ronald Reagan, seeking the Republican nomination for President, told the LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE in an exclusive interview, he will never pressure Israel to force a settlement in the Middle East, but would do everything in his power to bring the Jews and Arabs to the negotiating table.

Reagan said he will not recognize the Palestine Liberation Organization until the PLO recognizes Israel as a country with the right to exist.

When asked, the front - running G.O.P. contender replied: "Israel is not Expendable."

After carefully considering all pros and cons for the Republican nomination, we have determined that for American Jews Ronald Reagan is a better choice as contender for the Presidency than Gerald Ford.

We are thoroughly disillusioned by the broken promises of Ford and his Secretary of State Kissinger. All their words of assurance they will not let Israel down, is not in keeping with their actions of support for Egypt, indifference for Lebanon, pressure on the Jewish state and withholding of aid.

So we sought out and spoke with Sen. Paul Laxalt, chairman of national citizens committee for Reagan.

Reagan is a severe critic of "detente" as a one-way street, just as we are. Reagan accused Kissinger of being more concerned with "detente" than the pouring of Russian arms to Egypt to launch a surprise attack against Israel in 1973.

Reagan advocates a peaceful settlement in the Middle East, with a warning that the future of Israel must be insured.

CHURCH RAPS FORD FOR PRESSURING ISRAEL

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Ford Administration was accused by Sen. Frank Church (D, Idaho) with seeking a Middle East peace through concessions only from Israel.

"The legitimacy and

existence of Israel cannot be bartered away," he said. "Quiet diplomacy notwithstanding, we must declare in unmistakable terms that there can be no peace in the Middle East without and open and explicit acknowledgement (by the Arabs) that Israel exists, it will continue to exist and it has every right to exist." Church's speech was read by his wife Bethene to some 300 persons attending the 20th anniversary of Bar Ilan University. The Idaho senator, who is seeking the Democratic nomination for the Presidency, was in Oregon.

Mrs. Church, who was in Israel earlier this year, noted that she found there was a bond between Americans and Israelis. She said many of Israel's social problems were similar to those in the U.S. and she found the land and the people of Israel similar to her native Idaho.
