The scope of his foresight knew no bounds and his perception accepted no barriers. The areas he covered ranged from undersea to outer space. He knew and sanctioned every detail of sophisticated equipment invented, discovered or created by the scientists he employed, from infra-red sensors to electro-optical systems.

The marvel of Howard Hughes was his driving determination that never slowed or ceased, to provide the best know-how for improvement and perfection. His efforts played a large part in keeping America's military second to none and U.S. citizenry more comfortable and safe than anywhere else in the world.

As recent as 1968 the world's largest communications satellites were launched after being turned out at a Hughes plant. They were capable of carrying more than 5,000 two-way telephone calls and 12 color TV broadcasts-simultaneously. Two weeks later he produced a multi-plexed passenger entertainment and service system, described by experts as one of the most significant extensions of space age technology for commercial aircraft.

The Hughes 3-D radar was introduced as the only system for a restricted frontier area with the speed necessary to react. Then came an all-electronic memory device to speed, simplify and make most efficient computer information; a laser rangefinder for U.S. Army's Sheridan tanks which fired a light beam at 136,000 miles per second for computing range to score a direct hit on the first round; a radar system electronic extension of a fighter pilot's visual and mental facilities for F-15 superior fighter; AWG-9 airborne weapons control system for Navy's F-14 planes; a polymeric coating for electrical wiring that insulates from excessive heat; an Army tank-killer to penetrate enemy armor more than a mile away; and an Earth Resources Technology Satellite to measure and manage the natural resources upon which mankind depends for existence.

Howard Hughes was a man devoid of ego. Praise flustered him. He had no time for reflection. He was geared to go forward, to ameliorate the human race. He was truly a great American.

In his role as genius, visionary, inventor, mechanical wizard, humanitarian, movie maker, and patriot, his mission was accomplished.

It was a job well done.
