NEW YORK (WUP) received report here from the Paris office of the American Jewish Committee reveals that a peril faces the Jews in Lebanon. The report, based on a lengthy interview with recent Jewish arrivals from that strife - torn country, notes that "two aspects of the situation stand out.
