Mr. Rockefeller told the 250 invited guests that the Jewish experience in America is a "particularly vivid illustration of opportunity for the individual being translated into betterment for all,"

He added that we couldn't subtract the Jewish contribution from American life "without im-poverishing our science, our literature, our art, our commerce, our law -- indeed, without

vastly diminishing America. "The Jewish contribution to the American experience is beyond calculation -- and out of all proportion to the numbers of Jewish Americans involved.

The Vice President also said that the spiritual and religious forces which inspired our founding fathers, shaped life in America from its very beginnings. "These forces inspired the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States," he said. "And, most impor-tant, these spiritual and religious forces have continued to shape the American character to this day, a character dominated by such quali-ties as respect for the dignity of the individual. kindness, generosity, neighborliness, equality of opportunity, equality before the law, a restless energy, a willingness to take risks, and faith, hope and love. Rockefeller emphasized that today, the basic principles of America's founding and its growth --its dedication to human dignity and the spiritual nature of man, its trust in free individuals taking responsibility for their actions, are being serlously challenged.

FORD OPPOSES NEW ARAB **BOYCOTT CURB LAWS**

WASHINGTON (WNS) The Ford Administration continues to oppose additional legislation to curb to curb the boycott of Is -Arab rael.

"No additional legislation is necessary or desirable at this time," Treasury Sec-cretary William Simon told the House International Relations Committee, He said new laws "would be new laws detrimental to the of United totality of United States interests both States here and in the Middle East." Simon stress-ed that the Adminiswith Arabs and Is-raelis as has talked as well as n Jews on American on ways to eliminate discriminatory practices. "We have made the point that our basic goal must be to encourage progress toward peace," he said. "It is in our considered judgement that confrontational policies will not move to remove the boycott and could undermine the delicate search for peace in that troubled region of the world.

Will Maslow, But general counsel of the American Jewish Congress, and Seymour Graubard, cl of the B'nai chairman B'rith Anti-Defamation League, told the Com-mitee that voluntary action against the boycott has failed. They said that some busisome businessmen would like strong governmental laws to help them laws stand up against the boycott.

In testimony before the House Governmental Operations Subcommittee, Dr. Arthur F. Burns, chairman of the Federal Re-serve Board, said that chairman American banks play a major role in giving effect to the boycott in the U.S. He said if diplomatic action fails then Congress should act to control the problem. Rauer Meyer, director of the Commerce Depart-ment's Office of Ex-port Administration, testified that a de-partment survey found 119 American 119 American banks received 10,443 restrictive requests covering 5190 trans-actions during a four-month period. He said that in only 72 cases, in each of the months, did the banks refuse to process letters of credit or otherwise participate in the boy-cott. Rep. Benjamin S. Rosenthal (D.
