Jr., the U.S. Ambassador in Lebanon, and Ro bert O. Waring, the American Economic Coun-selor. The two diplomats and their chauffer were shot to death while driving to a meeting with the Lebanese President-elect Elias Sarkis. This despicable act against people working for peace can only arouse contempt and dis-gust," Rabin wrote.

Meanwhile, about 100 Lebanese refugees, mostly women and children, are in Israel. Some of them are staying with Maronite Christian families in Jish, the largest Maronite village in Israel. Others are receiving medical treatment in Israeli clinics and hospitals. Israeli officials are abiding by the request of the re-fugees that their names and pictures not be published for fear of reprisals when they return home.

## RABIN PRAISES U.S., BLASTS SOVIET UNION JERUSALEM (WNS) Premier Yitzhak -- Premier Rabin, in a detailed foreign policy review to the Knesset, prais-ed the United States and blasted the Soviet

Union. He said the USSR has become an even obstacle to greater peace than it was in the past. Rabin praised the Ford Administration for backing Is-rael's refusal to at-tend the Geneva Con-ference if the Palestine Liberation Organization was present. Rabin expressed ap-preciation for American aid and said while there were differences between Jerusalem and Washington they would

On specific Arab countries, Rabin said he "willingly noted" Syria's recent con-sent to renew the mandate of the United Nations Disengage-ment Observer Force on the Golan Heights with no conditions at-tached. But at the same time, he noted that Syria has shown no readiness to negotiate with Israel and is still demanding total Is-raeli withdrawal from administered territories as a condi-

tion for talks. The Premier said that Syria has not responded to the not i American - Israeli in-itiative and "this obstinancy is the ob-stacle on the road to peace." Rabin noted the quiet on the Egyp-tian front while ack-

nowledging that Egypt was still taking bitter anti-Israeli positions at the United Nations and other internation-"Indeed. al arenas. I cannot, regretfully, rule out the possibility of Egyptian recidi-

peace process, Rabin said. The Premier warned Jordanian King Hus-sein not to go too far in his "romance" with Syria or the

Likud leader Menachem Beigin, respond-ing to the Premier's address, charged that the government has no workable peace plan. He said Rabin himself had admitted that the Arabs would not accept Israel's most generous offers which would have Israel retain only part of the Golan Heights and all of Jerusalem and declared it was the "height of irrespon-sibility" for the government to major withdrawals in exchange for nonbelligerency.


