Britain and France also condemned the hijacking of the Air France plane and urged Security Council action against terror-

In his second appearance before the Council, Israeli Ambassador Chaim Herzog provided further evidence of collaboration by Ugandan President Idi Amin with the 'hijackers. He said additional terrorists were driven to Entebbe Airport in Ugandan cars to re-inforce the original four hijackers. He said the leader of hijackers, a German named Wilfried Bose, the hijackers, a German named Wilfried Bose had a route mapped out from Athens to Entebbe when the hijacking occurred. Noting that the Soviet Union had called the raid "aggression" Herzog asked why the USSR had not condemned the hijacking or any other terrorist acts by the Palestine Liberation Organization.

Meanwhile the State Department in Washington said that it has determined that Israel's rescue operation was justifiable under international law and the use of American - made military transports and other equipment in the raid
