EUROPEAN PUBLIC OPINION ELATED BY ISRAEL'S BRAVE ACTION

LONDON (WNS) -- Public opinion in West, Europe was highly pleased by the Israeli rescue of hostages held in Uganda. But some of the

official comments were more guarded.

Prime Minister James Callaghan issued a statement saying he was pleased at the outcome of the Air France hijacking affair, but he did not send an official message to Israel. Some members of Parliament have urged the government "to congratulate the government of Israel on brilliantly and bravely confounding an act of air pirary, to condemn President (Idi) Amin (of Uganda) for aiding and arming international terrorists, and to control terrorism both at home and abroad with equal vigor and determination." Labor MP Grenville Jamer urged the government to take action against Uganda, for its alleged collusion with the terrorists.

rejoicing and thanksgiving. Dr. Immanuel Jakobovits, Britain's Chief Rabbi, said in a special
appearance before the Board of Deputies of
British Jews, that the rescue was "one of the
most memorable episodes of our long bloodstained history." He noted that "in our synagogues we wept and pleaded with God for his
intervention and succor, now we have witnessed

a great salvation."

In West Germany, the government expressed "relief and satisfaction" over the success of the Israeli operation and observed that "the behavior of the authorities in Uganda needs clarification." The Bonn government also revealed that it never had any intention of submitting to the hisckers' demand for the release of six pro-Palestinian terrorists Imprisoned in West Germany. The government said the imprisoned terrorists were "not freedom fighters" as the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine claimed but "criminals wanted on murder and other capital charges." West Germany called on all nations to "double their efforts to combat the dangers emanating from terrorism." Former Chancellor Willy Brandt sent a message to the Israeli Ambassador in Bonn declaring that the rescue operation "will go down in history as an important date in the struggle against international terrorism."

In Vienna Austrian Chancellor Bruno Kreisky described the Israeli action as an "act of self defense." However, he said the hijacking of the Air France plane has no influence on his government's attitude to grant permission for the opening of an information office of the Palestine Liberation Organization. "It seems that the PLO had nothing to do with the hijacking of the Air France Plane," Kreisky said.

In the Netherlands, Foreign Minister Max

In the Netherlands, Foreign Minister Max Van Der Stoel gave a non-committal answer when asked about the Israeli operation on television, saying only that it was "unusual." The Netherlands - Israel Friendship League sent him a telegram expressing its "disappointment" over his lukewarm reaction. The Israeli Embassy in the Hague has received thousands of enthusiastic letters, cables and flowers from citizens throughout Holland congratulating Israel on its rescue operations.

In Paris, the French Foreign Ministry issued a brief statement expressing satisfaction at the outcome but deploring the casualties. Israeli circles in Paris were unhappy with the statement by the returned Air Force crew paying tribute to Amin. The French government, according to observers in Paris, fear the possible consequences of the Israeli action both in Africa and among the Arab states. However, the French press has approved the mission.

The Soviet Union denounced the Israeli action as another manifestation of "Zionist aggression" a violation of Ugandan sovereignty.
