Despite the U.S. ban on the transfer of American-made weapons to third countries, Admin-istration officials, in testimony before Congress, have conceded that there are no firm guarantees Istration officials, in testimony before Congress, have conceded that there are no firm guarantees that such transfers would not be made in the event of war. In fact, the large number of Sidewinders proposed for Saudi Arabia, far ex-ceeding that country's legitimate needs, would intensify pressure on Saudi Arabia to transfer the missiles to other Arab states. As Senator Clifford P. Case (R, N, J.), the ranking Minority Member of the Foreign Relations Committee, rightly warned: "These Sidewinders could also fall into the hands of the Soviet Union." The Sidewinder sale would strengthen the Arab states' military capability against Israel. The Arabs already enjoy an overall 3 - 1 ad-vantage in weapons and manpower over Israel. Another 2,000 Sidewinders added to the Arab stockpile of arms would reinforce the Arab goal of gaining air superiority over Israel in any future conflict. Egypt, reportedly deficient in air - to - air missiles, would be a logical destination for the Sidewinders in the event of

destination for the Sidewinders in the event of a war -- or even prior to it.

BILLIONS IN ARMS TO SAUDIS


The Defense Department announced that Saudi Arabia has now become America's number one arms purchaser, having concluded more than \$4 billion worth of military contracts this year \$4 billion worth of military contracts this year alone. Pentagon officials privately point to the desire of the Saudis to match the growing Iran-ian arsenal. The Saudis apparently find it "prestigious" to acquire the last word in U.S. military technology. Acquisition of these lethal status symbols is financed by their vast oil income. income.

The Defense Department, eager to promote these sales for a variety of reasons, is concerned over the negative reaction the disclsure of the Saudi deal has initially caused in the Congress, the public and the press. The New York Times (June 30) and The Philadelphia Inquirer

(June 21) have editorially opposed the sale. In an apparent effort to allay this concern and win approval for the Sidewinder deal, Deputy Secretary of Defense, William P. Clements, Jr. told the Times July 8 the Pentagon was ad-vising the Saudis that their air force was not yet ready to maintain and fly advanced F-14 and F-15 fighter planes, as they desire. Cle-ments cited this advice as an example of how the Defense Department, rather than promoting military sales, frequently attempts to impose restraint on foreign arms customers,

But Clements' self - serving interview is not likely to allay the continuing concern over the Sidewinder deal and other arms sales to Arab states. Even before a formal letter of offer has been sent to Capitol Hill, there are strong indications that the Congress will use the provisions of law applicable to government - to government sales in order to disapprove it entirely, if there is no drastic reduction in the quantity of missiles involved. In view of the high risks, this course would be in the best interests of peace.




