Dunes' Shenkers at Demo Conv NEW YORK CITY -- Lillian and Morris Shenker, prominent St. Louis attorneys and Jewish community leaders, came to the Demo-cratic National Convention with an "open mind"

about a Presidential candidate and returned home as "strong supporters" of Jimmy Carter. Morris Shenker, long active in the Demo-cratic Party, has attended nine national con-ventions. He described the 1976 event as the "best organized" of all, adding:

"Obviously, the credit for such efficient organization must go to Chairman Robert S. Strauss and to S. Lee Kling," (Kling, a St. Louis businessman, was treasurer of Arrange-ments Committee of the Convention. He is also Finance Chairman of the Democratic National Convention and chairman of its National Finance Council. He was assisted by another St. Louisan, Frank Jacobs, a vice chairman of the Executive Committee of the National Finance Council.)

Mrs. Shenker, aside from practicing law in St. Louis in her husband's law firm, is Execu-St. Louis in her husband's law firm, is Execu-tive Consultant, Design and Planning at the Dunes Hotel and Country Club in Las Vegas, Nevada, She also expressed enthusiasm about the convention, "It was like a breath of fresh air blown to the Democratic Party," she told me during an interview at the New York Hilton at Rockefeller Center, "What a sharp contrast from the last two conventions!" There was none from the last two conventions!! There was none of the negativism and divisiveness of previous years -- and it all ran smoothly and efficiently,

Morris Shenker, in a separate interview in his suite at the Americana Hotel, said he was "exceptionally impressed" by Presidential no-minee Jimmy Carter, "The more I see of Mr, Carter, the more I think of him," Shenker told Carter, the more I think of min, such a means me, "He says what he means and he means

Shenker, who is active in numerous Jewish organizations and civic affairs in St. Louis and in Las Vegas, where he is Chairman of the Board of the Dunes Hotel, continued: "Jimmy Carter relates well with people from all walks of life. He communicates with them rather than to them. The way be talks, the expressions he uses, the belief in himself and his cause -- all these make it easy to believe him." Shenker met Carter for the first time at a breakfast hosted by S, Lee Kling at New York's Statler Hilton at the close of the convention. "I'm leaving New York completely satis-fied that Limmy Carter can lead this country.

fied that Jimmy Carter can lead this country, and that he can restore the American people's confidence in their government," Shenker concluded.

cluded, As for Carter's choice of a vice president, Shenker observed: "I subscribe fully to Sena-tor Mondale's principles and ideals, Walter Mondale and Jimmy Carter will make an excel-lent team. Senator Mondale will contribute much to the campaign and to the victory in November." November.

November," Mrs. Shenker added that Jimmy Carter "will be able to inspire confidence in our country and in our people -- and this is what has been lacking in the last few years. "1 firmly believe that Carter is a winner and that he is the kind of man our country has long needed and has long waited for," she said. "1 came here with an open mind and with no allegiance to anyone, and I really have the feel-ing now that our party is going in the right ing now that our party is going in the right direction."

A highlight of the Shenkers' New York stay was a visit to the Dance Festival at the Clark Center for the Performing Arts at the City University, where their daughter, Patty, 24, was both choreographer and danced. Patty created and danced "Clara's Lament" based on the story of the American composer Robert Schumann and his widow, Clara, who helped immortalize her husband's music through her own plane virtuesity.
