## Coexistence

It is symptomatic of the situation in the Middle East that it took the tragedy of the civil war in Lebanon to prove once again that Jews and Arabs can coexist for their mutual benefit if Arabs can coexist for their mutual benefit if there were only a willingness by the Arab side. This is being demonstrated by the thousands of Lebanese villagers, who have braved threats from the terrorists, to come through "breaks" in the Israeli security fence along the Leban-ese border to seek medical aid from Israel. The Israeli clinics are an unprecedented humanitarian gesture to people from what is after all enemy territory and who are returning to their land after treatment. It follows the


to their land after treatment. It follows the traditional practice of treating patients from all Arab countries at Israeli hospitals.

Nothing, however, is learned from these hu-manitarian gestures at the United Nations. In fact, it would not be too surprising for the Arabs to try to find a way to condemn the Israeli medical help at the World Health Organization or in other UN bodies. 10

But the Lebanese villagers continue to come to Israel for help and the two - way traffic has now blossomed out into an exchange of trade, with the Israelis buying agricultural crops in return for food badly needed by the Lebanese. Israel has also piped in water needed by the Lebanese for themselves and their animals.

Defense Minister Shimon Peres and other Israelis have expressed the hope that this will be the beginning of a two - way tradesimilar to the exchange that has been going on across the Jordan River for years.

No one knows what will happen once the Lebanese internal conflict ends. But there are some Israelis who believe that peace will come to the Middle East not through peace treaties but through informal contacts such as trade and tourism which will gradually evolve into more formal relations. If this is true, then the flow through the security fence "breaks" may be an example of what could be ahead,

Entwined in this moving tale of facts are the pur-pose and ideals behind the creation of the State of Israel and what it is up against in this world.

There was always the fear of hitting Entebbe to find the hostages gones. A watch was kept on Uganda Pres, Amin by round-the-clock Israeli air missions to shadow his private jet. On the spot intelligence flowed in from every source. Abie Nathan, the Peace Pilot, flew to Uganda and spoke to a hijacker behind a closed door.

The rising probability of executions put pres-sure on Prime Minister Rabin. He wanted no rescue operations with soldiers holding one-way tickets. He wanted proof positive the first plane can land safely and get back. Shomron summed it up with the key words,

"Secrecy, speed and surprise." One of the jet pilots of the rescue mission described the circumstances. "A little earlier I was sitting on a yacht. In the peaceful atmosphere of a summer evening, I never imagined that within hours I would be called to fly 20 tons of fuel to Kenya, which could explode through a moment of carelessness or blow up if hit by a chance Ugandan shell. Lieut, Col. Yehonatan "Yonni" Netanyahu,

who lead the expedition and was the only Israeli commando slain, explained the problem: "to reach the hostages at high speed and eliminate the hijackers. It is a matter of seconds between success and massacre."

Peres called the operation "the farthest in range, the shortest in time and the boldest in imagination.

A million dollar Israeli mobile fuel pump, adopted to serve the four Hercules from Entebbe's tanks, was left behind to make room for Soviet - built equipment and machinery taken from the quarters of Palestinian pilots learn-ing to fly the Puscies, built Miss ing to fly the Russian - built Migs.
