Sources in Jerusalem said the talks, held at Rosh Hanikra on the Israeli - Lebanese border, were request-ed by the Arab Lebanese Army and arranged through the United Nations representa-tives in the area area The two sides discussed problems con-cerning the border, including the crossing into Israel of villagers from southern Lebanon for medical aid, trade and employment.

The Arab Lebanese Army is made up of Moslem soldiers, by Lt. Ahmed El Khatib, who broke away from the regular regular Lebanese armed for-ces which is headed by a Christian general. Some Jerusalem sources say that the meetings now going on are the result of a common desire by Israel and the Arab Lebanese Army to keep Syria out of southern Lebanon.

WASHINGTON (JTA) -- Sen, Richard Schweiker of Pennsylvania, selected by Ronald Reagan to be his running - mate if he wins the Republican nomination for the Presidency, is easily one of the strongest supporters of Congressional legislation in support of Israel's requirements and Soviet Jewry.

Frequently honored by Jewish organizations for his activities on liberal causes and issues

for his activities on liberal causes and issues affecting the Jewish community during his 16 years in the House and Senate, Schweiker has been outspoken in insisting on economic and military assistance for Israel and in providing teeth in laws to help the emigration of Jews and others from the Soviet Union.

The 50 - year - old Schweiker, who was reelected two years ago to his second Senate term, was one of 34 Senators who last month opposed the retention of Air Force General George S. Brown as chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

and that is no understatement.
