### RAEL PATROLLING LEBANESE

TEL AVIV (WNS) -Intensified patrols off the south Lebanese coast are being con-ducted by the Israeli navy in an effort to make it difficult for the terrorist organi-zations and the leftist forces in Lebanon to receive military supplies.
