But after listening to either of them all day, you would still have to read the New York Times to find out what really happened.

Why?

Because the stations which advertise "all news all day long" don't give you all the news. They merely select some news items and

keep repeating them.

Furthermore, these radio stations miss a great opportunity in not broadcasting, in full, the fascinating talks given at conferences throughout the world.

After all, radio and tv are at their best not

when they stage programs but when they extend

our ears and eyes and let us eavesdrop on events that are taking place. And these all - news radio stations majorize and these all - news radio stations majorize in minors. Every five minutes or so they give you the weather. Frequently, the forecasts are wrong but they never acknowledge their errors but keep pontificating about what the weather'll be like, frightening many people.

A few drops of rain -- or snow -- get herald-

And those commercials!

Those inane, puerile, mendacious, wheedling commercials! They're enough to undermine the credibility of the other material oozing out of the mike. The reiteration of commercials is designed
