GOP DRAFTS STRONG ISRAEL PLANK COMMITMENT FUNDAMENTAL, ENDURING

RABIN SEES LONG LEBANON CONFLICT

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The conflict in Lebanon will continue for a long time, Premier Yitzhak Rabin predicted in an interview with the Histadrut newspaper Davar.

However, he noted that once the conflict is over, the Lebanese border will present a special threat to Israel.

Meanwhile, the Premier said that Syria is the "central military element in Lebanon" and that Syria is "interested in a calm border with Israel to avoid any Israeli pretext for intervention in Lebanon." He said the success of Israel's policy has proven itself by the fact that there are no foreign forces in southern Lebanon near the Israeli border.

Rabin said that the Lebanese conflict has prevented the Arab world from considering a possible settlement with Israel while also lessening the danger of an Arab military coalition against Israel. "I prefer this reality rather than a concentration of the radical Arab forces for a confrontation with Israel," he said.

Declaring that the Palestine Liberation Organization has destroyed the co-existence between Moslems and Christians in Lebanon, Rabin said the Lebanese conflict has provided the opportunity for a public opinion campaign against the PLO. "The PLO has undoubtedly proved itself to be a cancerous body in the entire fabric of the Arab world," he said.

Meanwhile, the Israeli Minister of Agriculture is considering a request from South Lebanese villagers for Israeli agricultural experts to help them with various problems including a mysterious disease that has attacked their fruit trees. The Lebanese have also asked that Israeli veterinarians inoculate their livestock against hoof and mouth disease.

In another development, Israeli army medical teams on the Lebanese border have begun distributing postcards to the Lebanese villagers to enable them to communicate with relatives in Israel. Israel is considering allowing visits back and forth by Israeli and Lebanese Arabs.

KANSAS CITY (WNS) -- President Ford won the nomination for the Republican candidacy for the Presidency after a tough bitter struggle with former California Gov. Ronald Reagan at the Republican National Convention here.

But the two opposing forces were united in drafting and approving a platform that included a strong pro-Israel plank. "Our commitment to Israel is fundamental and enduring," the Middle East plank said. "We have honored and will continue to honor that commitment in every way -- politically, economically and by providing the military aid that Israel requires to remain strong enough to deter any potential aggression."

The plank stressed that "An equally important component of our commitment to Israel lies in continuing our efforts to secure a just and durable peace for all nations in that complex region. Peace in the Middle East now requires face-to-face direct negotiations between the states involved with the recognition of safe, secure and defensible borders for Israel."

The platform attacked the Arab oil embargo imposed during the 1973 Yom Kippur War and (Continued on Page 2)

Voter is Boss

When the founders of our country signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, they intended "certain unalienable rights, along with Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness, that Government, instituted among men, derive their just powers from the consent of the governed."

Unfortunately, it has not worked out that way. It started with Alexander Hamilton's theory and policy that the powers of government should be dictated by those doing the governing, who were "the wealthy, the good, and the wise."

Hamilton was opposed by Jefferson, the first great Democrat, who had complete faith that a people enlightened by education, could govern themselves better.

Down through the years, because of uncertainty, or unfamiliarity with the issues, or due to plain laxity, the voter has allowed himself to be coerced into electing figure heads. This led to unscrupulous politicians gaining office for their own selfish purposes.

Then came Watergate, the grand-daddy of all scandals. The old order changed overnight.

John Doe, the man in the street, the average citizen, has awakened to the realization that our country belongs to him. He could fight city hall. He was not going to be told anymore. He was going to do the telling.

That is why Jack Tell filed for State Assembly in the Fifth District, to introduce a new concept in political office seeking.

The voter is the boss, not only when he hires the candidate by electing him, but all during the tenure in office. This is accomplished without any qualification by a sworn, signed, sealed affidavit, duly notarized. It is a binding contract between the voters and the man elected.

If this theory proves successful, it will lead to aspirants for higher office applying the same tactics for victory. In time all the governments, local, state and national, will be returned to the voters where they belong.

No longer will ambitious, power seeking zealots turn to politics for a career of affluence. Special interests, lobbyists, those with ulterior motives, will no longer cater to him. They will have to appeal to the voters, which is what it should have been all along.

The person elected will no longer be a leader. He will be an employee, trusted to be sure, who will carry out the orders of his bosses, the voters.
