

REQUEST ABSENTEE BALLOTS BY SEPT. 7

With the September 14th Primary just a few short weeks away the Clark County Election Department would like to advise all people who will be out of town or unable to go to the polls on Election Day that the time for requesting absentee ballots will end on Tuesday, September 7th, 1976.

Requests for absentee ballots for the Primary must be in writing. The requester must indicate his local address as well as the out of town address to which the absentee ballot should be sent. For registered voters who are confined to their homes or for some reason are unable to go to the polling place, an absentee ballot can be sent to them at their local address.

For registered voters who are leaving town prior to the Election and will have no permanent out of town address to which an absentee ballot can be sent, the law provides for absentee voting at the Clark County Election Department in advance of their leaving. Absentee voting at the Clark County Election Department will begin on Tuesday, August 24th and will end on Tuesday, September 7th. After September 7th, for those people suddenly called out of town or unexpectedly confined to their home or hospital, emergency absentee provisions

are available by either voting at the Clark County Election Department or requesting an absentee ballot to be sent to their place of confinement. For people who find themselves unexpectedly confined to Hospitals or Convalescent Homes and their stay will continue through Election Day, special pink absentee ballot request forms can be provided by the Hospitals' Public Relations Staff upon request.

It is important to remember that all absentee ballots must be voted and returned to the Election Department prior to 7:00 P.M. on Election Day, Tuesday, September 14th.

ISRAEL'S POPULATION IS 3,493,000

After the Olympiad one of the officials said the event merited a gold medal "for politics."

The officials certainly did not merit a medal for the brushoff they gave to three widows of victims of the Munich-murders in 1972.

The widows, Sara Shor, Ilana Romany and Anki Spitzer made the trip from Israel to beg for a moment of silence to memorialize the Munich martyrs.

The officials first chided them for being so emotional about the matter.

Pressed further, they said they didn't want to have politics intrude into the sports program.

The widows responded by saying that refusal to honor their spouses was in itself yielding to politics and capitulating to murderers and their supporters.

But the martyrs were remembered in Montreal at a huge service at Congregation Shaar Shomayim, where the spiritual guide is Rabbi Wilfred Schuchat. Thousands of people, led by Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau, were on hand for the moving event.

The leaders of Montreal Jewry went out of their way to make the Israeli widows (one of whom is a convert to Judaism) comfortable, and also to entertain the entire Israeli contingent.

When that contingent made its first appearance in the stadium it was accorded a thunderous ovation. After it was over, a wet-eyed Mrs. Shor said that the cheers were tantamount to the memorialization she had pleaded for, in vain, with the hard-hearted "non-political" Olympic committee.

About 27 percent of Israel's Jewish population resides in Jerusalem, Tel Aviv and Haifa.

During 1975, 20,028 immigrants came to Israel and an additional 9,200 arrived during the first six months of this year.
