JIMMY CARTER SUPPORT FOR ISRAEL "UNDEVIATING, UNEQUIVOCAL"

RABIN SAYS NO PEACE IN NEAR FUTURE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- An Israeli - Arab peace settlement may still take "one, two or three generations," Premier Yitzhak Rabin told the 300 American

Jewish leaders participating in the United Jewish Appeal's Prime Minister's Mission to Israel.

Addressing them at a dinner in the Knesset, he said the Sinai agreement signed with Egypt a year ago was a small step toward peace that has reduced the danger of war. Rabin stressed that before Israel turns to anyone for economic help "we reduce our own standard of living and we hope you will be with us in any way you find possible."

Pledges of contributions at the dinner for the 1977 UJA campaign totaled more than \$21 million, \$5 million more than the pledges at last year's Prime Minister's Mission.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Democratic Presidential candidate Jimmy Carter opened his campaign for Jewish support with appearances before 70 Jewish community leaders from across the country in Atlanta and 300 persons, most of whom were rabbis, at a meeting sponsored by the New York Board of Rabbis here.

Carter told both groups that his support for Israel was "undeviating, unequivocal" and that he would back "whatever military and economic aid that is necessary to let Israel defend itself." He drew enthusiastic applause when he said that the Palestinian problem must be solved through humane means but that any solution must "recognize that the Israelis did not cause the Palestine problem."

Carter said a Middle East settlement must include recognition by the Arab states of Israel's right to exist and must leave Israel with secure and defensible boundaries. He said he would never pressure Israel to make any decisions it did not want to and scored what he called comments by national leaders that cause "uncertainty" about the American stand on Israel. He said the American people overwhelmingly support Israel.

In his appearance before the New York Board of Rabbis, which was held at Manhattan's Fifth Avenue Synagogue, Carter refused to go on record on whether he would move the United States Embassy in Israel from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem. Acknowledging that the Democratic Party platform called for such a move, Carter said that he would reserve his decision until he takes office since if a delay in moving the embassy
