to Jerusalem would help the Mideast peace negotiations he would hold up the move.

Asked about his religious views, Carter said that as a Baptist he believes in separation of church and state. He said if he is elected, "I don't intend to worship with the White House as a public place" but would instead join the nearest Baptist church where he would attempt to worship in as quiet and private a manner as possible. In Atlanta, where the Jewish leaders, most of whom were planning to campaign for Carter were briefed by his campaign staff, Stuard Eizenstat, director of issues, noted that as Governor of Georgia Carter ended the practice of holding prayer breakfasts at the Governor's Mansion.

**ANTI-SEMITISM IN ARIZONA GOP PRIMARY**

WASH. (WNS) -- Sen. Barry Goldwater (R. Ariz.) has expressed concern about the anti-Semitic campaign being waged against Rep. Sam Steiger, a Jew, by his opponent in the Republican primary race for a candidate to succeed retiring Republican Sen. Paul Fannin.

Steiger, 47, who has been in Congress for 10 years is being opposed by Rep. John Conlan, 45, a two-term Congressman who is leader of a controversial "Get Christians into Elective Politics" group. Both Congressmen are staunch conservatives with almost identical records. The Wall Street Journal reported that many Arizona Jews are "uneasy" over the "gutter-style way a religious issue has entered the race". Goldwater said "we have heard Conlan is using anti-Semitic remarks about Steiger" and that he "is calling him a Jew in an uncomplimentary way. This is very unusual in Arizona."

Goldwater, who described himself as half Jewish, said "We are very concerned about anti-Semitism creeping into any campaign and I don't want to be associated with anything like that." He declared he would "disavow that in the Republican party as long as I am around."

The Journal said that Conlan has been endorsed by Billy Graham. Conlan denied to the Journal that there is anti-Semitism in his campaign. He told the Journal he is an "independent Protestant" without any bigotry although he admits his talks to church and evangelical groups are meant to encourage Christians to become "more politically active."

The Journal quoted Steiger as saying "I have been in Arizona politics since 1950 and the Jewish business has never surfaced before. I am sure John (Conlan) did not instigate this but it reflects the kind of people his campaign attracts."

**TAX PENALTIES FOR BOYCOTT COMPLIANCE**

WASH. (WNS) -- A Senate - House conference committee has approved lifting tax benefits for American corporations that comply with the Arab boycott of Israel.

The committee adopted the proposal sponsored by Sen. Abraham Ribicoff (D. Conn.) as part of the Trade Reform Bill. The measure is opposed by the Administration on the grounds it would hamper trade and diplomacy. The Ribicoff provisions would deny federal tax benefits to the portion of the company's sales or purchases that can be attributed to compliance with the Arab boycott.

The benefits are the foreign tax credit, deferral of taxation on foreign earnings and tax benefits for exports from the United States. Ribicoff's provisions describe boycott compliance as: a company agreeing not to do business with a specified country; agreeing not to do business with other countries that do business with that specified country; agreeing not to hire employees or directors because of their nationality, race or religion or agreeing not to do business with a company whose directors or managers are of a specific nationality, race or religion.

Meanwhile the House International Relations Committee adopted by a 27-1 vote an amendment to the Export Administration Act that provides that no country can

comply with the Arab boycott. The bill must now go to a conference since the Senate version forbids a company from refusing to do business with another American company that deals with

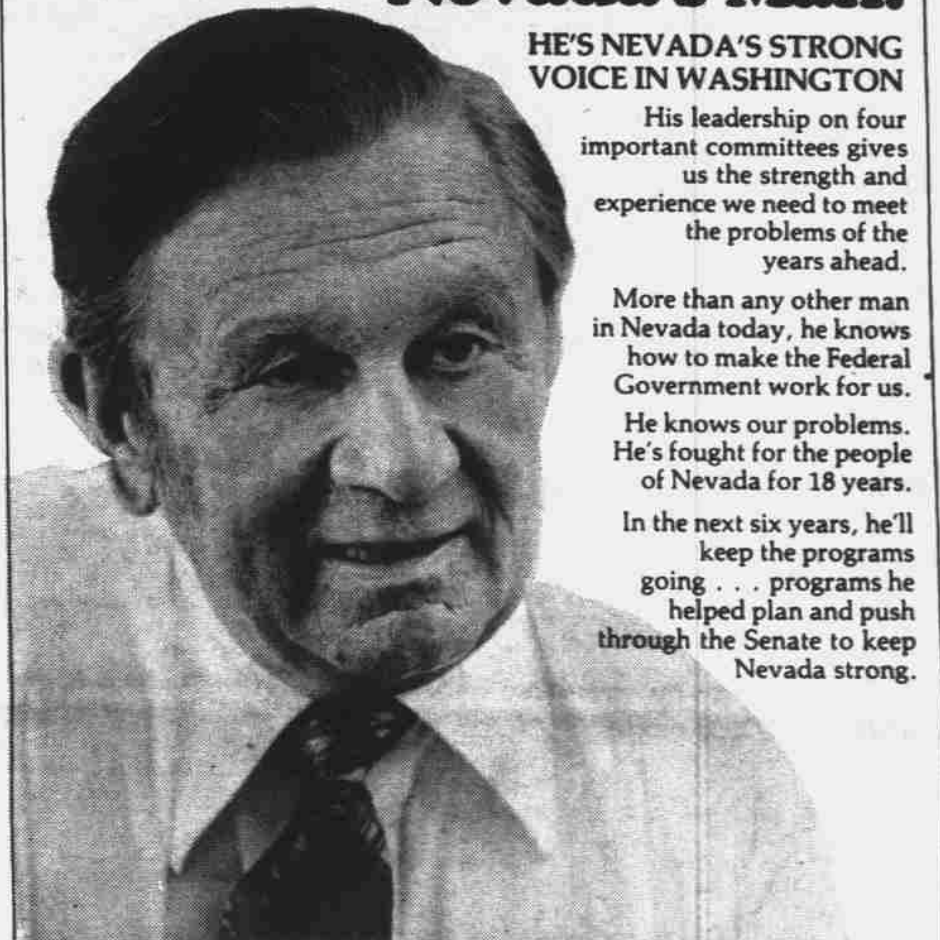
Israel but does not prohibit that company from refusing to deal with Israel. The House bill would also allow an American company to take action in federal court and seek damages from a com-

pany that refused to deal with it because of the first company's trade with Israel.
