Surety agent runs for commission

Joseph Abrahams, a surety agent and owner of a local bonding company, has joined the candidates seeking election to county commission seat F.

Abrahams, 44, is a Democrat and a resident of Las Vegas for 42 years.

His job experience includes motel ownership, co-ownership of a taxi cab company, cost accountant and senior administrative assistant for Reynolds Electric at the Nevada Test Site. He is a former member of two trade unions and a Korean War veteran.

This combination of experience, according to Abrahams, gives him an excellent background to serve as a county commissioner.

"I feel the job of county commissioner requires that the candidate be knowledgeable in the needs and problems of county government," he explains. "He must have an understanding of what makes our county government work, a basic knowledge of tourism, an understanding of both the problems of labor and management, a working concept of budgeting and planning, some idea of the problems faced by law enforcement agencies and other county services, the effects of real estate zoning in rela-

tion to the economy and be able to understand future growth projections," said Abrahams.

Calling "competence" the chief need of the county commission, incumbent commissioner David Canter, 39, has filed for re-election. He will run county-wide for seat C, a two year term.

A Democrat, Canter was elected for four years in 1974, but his term was cut in half by the Nevada Supreme Court ruling that the present commission structure was unconstitutional.

Saying that "quiet competence brings bold results," Canter developed the county task force concept, in which he has brought non county administrators to problem areas for a fast and final solution of citizen problems.

Canter has also re-written various commission ordinances, rules and by-laws to establish easier access and fairer procedures for citizens appearing before the commission.

As a county commissioner, Canter has served as vice-chairman of the Metropolitan Police Commission, trustee of Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital and director of the Las Vegas Valley Water District, Clark County Sanitation District and McCarran Airport, as well as a member of the Clark County Liquor and Gaming Board.

Elected to the Clark County School Board in 1970 and voted board vice-president three years later, Canter has represented both the board and commission on the Regional Planning Council.

Canter has received three gubernatorial appointments. Governor Mike O'Callaghan named him to the State School Advisory Committee in 1971 and the Eldorado Valley Advisory Group in 1975. Canter also served Senator Paul Laxalt on his Open Housing Fact Finding Committee in 1968 while Laxalt was governor.

A graduate of Northwestern University and Ohio State's College of Law, Canter is President of Canter Advertising Agency. He and his wife, Bonnie, have two children, Kaycee 7, and Murphy, 5.
