WILLIAM COMPTON FOR DISTRICT JUDGE

Former Judge William P. Compton, a Clark County resident since 1946, has filed for elec-tion to Department of the Eighth Judicial District Court in Las Vegas,

Judge Compton did undergraduate work at the University of Pittsburgh and the University of Pennsylvania and received his Juris Doctor degree in Law at the University of Virginia, Finishing at the top of his law class, he served as an editor of the Law Review while in law school at Virginia,

Upon graduation he was invited to serve as law clerk to the Hon, Armistead M, Dobie, then a member of the Fourth United States Court of Appeals, whose jurisdiction covered Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, and North and South Carolina. He served as clerk to the Judge for two years.

A member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of the United States, the Judge was admitted to the Bar in Virginia in 1943 and the Nevada State Bar in 1947; he practiced in Las Vegas until January, 1950, when he was appointed Assistant United States Attorney for Nevada. He served four years and then returned to private practice. Since then he served as a member of the Board of Barexaminers for five years and for approximately one and one-half years was City Attorney of Henderson, Nevada.

Elected to the bench in 1960 to complete the term of the late Judge A.S. Henderson, he was re-elected in 1962, and each four years thereafter until 1975.

He served as Juvenile Judge in 1961 and from 1962 to 1969. During his tenure the new Juven-ile Home and Child Haven was built on East Bonanza, and the Judge guided much of the de-velopment at Spring Mountain Youth Camp, Dur-ing his regime, the first full - time psycholo-gist was added to the staff of the juvenile services. Judge Compton participated in the es-tablishment of the first Juvenile Traffic Court in Las Vegas. He also established the first Truancy Court in Las Vegas which drastically reduced the number of truancy repeaters in the Clark County Schoola.

The Judge was invited to and participated in the National Conference on "Judicial Concern for Children" sponsored by the National P.T.A. and the National Juvenile Court Foundation held in both San Francisco and Chicago.

He was formerly Chief Judge of the Eighth Judicial District Court, and formerly advisory Judge to the Clark County Grand Jury.

As a long time member of the National Coun-cil of Juvenile Court Judges, he was successful in obtaining for Las Vegas the first and only Juvenile Judges Conference ever held here. This was in 1969.
