

AL PERRAH FOR COMMISSIONER F

Dissatisfaction with the way the present County Commission has performed has brought Democratic candidate Albert Perrah into the race for County Commissioner, Seat F.

Perrah, 43, is a local businessman. He has been a resident of Las Vegas for the past 9 years and is a native of Massachusetts. He is a graduate of Westfield State College and has a Masters Degree in

Administration. He is a veteran of 15 years in the teaching profession, of which four years were in the capacity of Dean of Students in Clark County School District.

Perrah states, "I finally came to the conclusion that if you weren't willing to devote the time and effort necessary to help change the things that are wrong in Clark County, then you shouldn't be too critical of those making the decisions. It's time those decisions were made on the basis of 'What's right for the citizens of Clark County.'"

Perrah is also an advocate of closer working relations with the employees of Clark County, particularly the Firemen and Metro Police. He feels there is no need for the constant friction between the Commission and these employees. "The lines of communication have to be kept open. Granted there are problems, but none that can't be solved by working honestly and openly

with each other," he maintains.

Concerning consolidation, Perrah feels that it is a dead issue until the State Constitution can be changed to make it legal. Then it should be put before an informed public. My personal feelings are just one vote. The majority of the voters have to decide their stand on consolidation. My job, if elected, is to vote as instructed by them.

Perrah is strongly opposed to closed meetings of the Commission. He feels the voters have the right to know, at all times.

Perrah, a resident of Las Vegas for ten years, is married, three children,
