

JOHN VERGIELES FOR ASSEMBLY 10

Assemblyman John M. Vergiels has filed for reelection in District 10.

Vergiels, 38, is a Democrat. He lives at 3699 Visby Lane with his wife, Erin.

He is an associate professor of education at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. He has been with the university since 1968, and before that he was a doctoral student at the University of Toledo.

Other candidates who filed in District 10 are Samuel J. Margolies, Frank Hine, Charles Romanelli and Louis E. Fry, Democrats; Chester F. Arden, Republican and John J. Seevala, Libertarian.

Vergiels has not yet taken a firm stand on the Equal Rights Amendment. However, he is going to send out some 3,800 questionnaires which will ask District 10 voters their stands on the ERA and 30 other issues.

District 10 is roughly bounded by Valley View Boulevard on the west, Spring Mountain Road, Sahara Avenue and Desert Inn Road on the north, Apalachi Way on the east and Tropicana Avenue and Flamingo Road on the south.

TRUDEAU PLEDGES AID TO ISRAEL

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Canadian Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau, on a private visit to Israel, pledged that Canada would do its utmost to help Israel.

In an exchange of toasts at a dinner for Trudeau and his wife, by Premier Yitzhak Rabin, the Canadian said that Israel and Canada could "do

things in common to build the future because both were relatively new democracies built by immigrants." Trudeau has had private meetings with both Rabin and Foreign Minister Yigal Allon.

But Trudeau left Israel after refusing to answer reporters questions on Canada's Middle East policy. However, his press spokesman, denied to Israeli reporters a report in the Toronto Star that Canada plans to make a more pro-Arab stand at the United Nations.

Mark Gayn, the Star's foreign affairs writer, wrote that Canada is expected to "tilt" away from Israel and toward

the Arabs, especially the Palestine Liberation Organization, as a result of its expected membership on the Security Council. He said this would be done in the name of a "balanced, objective and even-handed approach" to the Mideast.

But in Ottawa, Ivan Head, Trudeau's foreign advisor, said Canada's foreign policy is based on Canadian interests and cannot be interpreted under any circumstances as being directed against such traditional friends as Israel. He said the Canadian policy in the Mideast is to support the political independence and territorial integrity of Israel and all other Mideast countries.
