

JANICE HAYES FOR ASSEMBLY 12

A Clark County School District special education teacher, Janice M. Hayes, filed her candidacy as a Republican for Assembly District 12.

Hayes resides at 1609 Chapman. A resident of Las Vegas for 13 years, she is involved and has one grown daughter.

She earned a bachelor of arts degree in English from the University of Redlands in California. Hayes attended the University of California at Riverside and received a master of education degree from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

The candidate is working toward completion of her doctorate in education on a part-time basis at the University of Southern California.

Since she came to Las Vegas in 1963, Hayes has joined such organizations as Nevadans for the Equal Rights Amendment, the Association for Retarded Children and the Business and Professional Women's Association. She is also active in numerous teacher organizations.

Hayes has been a member of the Republican party for the past 10 years and a member of its county central committee.

The candidate said she decided to enter her first

race for public office because she wanted to implement some of the ideas she has advocated during her years in Nevada.

"I think I have some good ideas for lowering taxes, finding new sources of tax revenue, reducing the crime rate and drug addiction," she said. "I thought if I ran for the assembly, I might get some of those things done."

She said her candidacy should be supported because she represents a fresh approach to issues.

Hayes supports the Equal Rights Amendment. She said it would be better if the legislature would approve the ERA rather than force the federal government to enact laws which

Joseph T. LaVoie, a member of the Nevada Taxicab Authority who filed as a candidate for state Senate in District Three, claimed he will fight for revision of state real estate statutes if elected.

LaVoie, 60, of 108 Rancho Vista Drive served with the Las Vegas Police Department for more than 20 years and at one time was chief of the Juvenile Division. He retired from the police force in 1966.

"People have had enough faith in Nevada to put their life savings into real estate," he said. But restrictions on the sale and subdivision of large land parcels has been unfair to the landowners, the candidate declared.

LaVoie said he believes the consolidation issue should be left up to the voters. He declined to take a stand on the controversy, but promised to do his "utmost" to bring consolidation to a referendum vote.

He called for tougher adult criminal penalties and said juvenile offenders certified as adults should remain in that classification. He said he had learned some juvenile offenders

would eliminate sex discrimination on a national level. "It would be better for our legislature to pass laws that affect us in Nevada."

Active in the women's rights movement, Hayes said the ERA would not destroy women's rights but would extend those rights—even to include men. As an example of this, she said social security benefits were recently awarded to widowers.

classified as adults for one crime had been placed in the juvenile category for other offenses. He said the proposal would hold only for the most serious offenses.

At the same time, LaVoie said he favored the death penalty for "atrocious crimes."

LaVoie, a Democrat, will face opposition in the district which covers a majority of the land in the Las Vegas city limits, except for West Las Vegas, from incumbents Helen Herr, Richard Bryan, Floyd Lamb and Keith Ashworth, as well as political newcomers Roy V. Castle and William Hernstadt. There are four seats available in the District Three race.

The candidate expressed support for the Equal Rights Amendment. "I believe women should have their rights if they want them," he said. "But they

YUGOSLAVIA, CUBA ANTI-ISRAEL

WASH. (WNS) -- Yugoslavia and Cuba are going to lead the anti-Israel, anti-Jewish offensive at the upcoming United Nations General Assembly, Chaim Herzog, Israel's Ambassador to the UN, told the B'nai B'rith.

"Over the past year (we have) been experiencing a major anti-Semitic attack against our people on the part of Yugoslavia, Cuba and others," Herzog said. "The Yugoslavs have made some of the strongest possible attacks on our people on the United Nations front." But he said that in the face of this anti-Semitic offensive there is a "silence" on the part of world Jewry.

"If there is one should take a good, hard look at the amendment first."

He said he decided to run because of his availability to devote full-time effort to legislative issues without interference from private business matters.

LaVoie has served as vice chairman of the Democratic party in Clark County and president of the Las Vegas Police Protective Association. He also has been president of the Friends of Youth and chairman of the summer youth camp operated by the organization.

A resident of Clark County since 1939, LaVoie and his wife, Wilma, are the parents of two married children residing in the Las Vegas area.
