The candidate is working toward completion of her doctorate in education on-a part-time basis at the Univemity of Southern Califor-

Since she came to Las Vegas in 1963, Hayes has joined such organizations as Nevadans for the Equal Rights Amendment, the Association for Retarded Children and the Business and Professional Women's Association. She is also active in numerous teacher organizations.

Hayes has been a member of the Republican party for the past 10 years and a member of its county central committee.

race for public office because she wanted to implement some of the ideas she has advocated during her years in Nevada.

She said her candidacy should be supported because she represents a fresh approach to issues.

Joseph T. LaVoie, a member of the Nevada Taxicab Authority who filed as a candidate for state Senate in District Three, claimed he will fight for revision of state real estate statutes if elected.

LaVoie, 60, of 108 Rancho Vista Drive served with the Las Vegas Police Department for more than 20 ears and at one time was chief of the Juvenile Division. He retired from the police force in 1966.
