An unprecedented \$21,723,813 was pledged to this year's Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon Against Muscular Dystrophy. This sum, an all - time record, exceeds by \$2.9 million the \$18.8 million pledged during Telethon '75.

Jerry's 21-1/2 hour Telethon, originating from the Sahara Hotel Space Center in Las Vegas, was carried by 200 television stations nationwide. The highlight of the show was the re-

The highlight of the show was the reunion of Jerry and his former partner Dean Martin, together again on the same stage after 20 years. It was Frank Sinatra, who, for his appearance on the show, brought Martin with

him to surprise Jerry.

The show included appearances by such stars as Perry Como, Tony Bennett, and for the first time on American television, the Moiseyev Dancers. The show also featured production numbers from five Broadway shows, and over 100 stars both in Las Vegas and New York.

In an emotion - packed ending to this historic marathon broadcast, Jerry said that the result "is proof that if you stick together -if you do the right thing -- the Man upstairs
is going to bring us all together and he did."


