COMMERCE DEPT. AIDS ARAB BOYCOTT

WASH, (WNS) subcommittee of the House Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce has charged that the Depart-Commerce ment of "actually "actually serves to encourage" Arabboycott practices against American companies trading with Israel.

After an 18 - month study, the subcommittee on oversight and investigations issued a 30,000 - word re-port in which it con-cluded that "at least \$4.5 billion worth of U.S. sales and pro-posed sales to Arab countries in 1974 and 1975 were subject to boycott requests." The report estimated

American ex-ers "complied that porters "complied with at least 90 per-cent" of all boycott "implicitly by condoning activity against national policy or simply by looking the other way while these practices grew."

At a news confer-ence, Reps. John Moss (D, Calif), the sub-committee's chairman; James Scheuer (D, NY), who request-ed the subcommittee's investigation, and Hen-ry Waxman (D. Calif.) blamed former Com-merce Secretary Rogers Morton and the Commerce Depart-Department's policy since 1965 as being chiefly responsible for what Scheuer called "a record of 10 years of shame."

The 1965 Export Administration Act calls for reports from American companies subjected to demands by Arab countries to boycott Am American with Israel or having Jew-ish owners or management. Morton had refused to make the reports public and only did so under a threat of being cited for con-tempt by the Com-merce Committee.

his Democratic opponent, Jimmy Carter, in two separate appearances before the international convention of B'nai B'rith, pledged to work to an end of the Arab boycott.

Carter, who addressed the 1500 persons attending the largest convention in B'nai B'rith history first, accused the Administration of having "shut its eyes to the boycott" and failed to carry out a firm policy. "If I become President all laws concerning the boycott will be vigorously endorced." Carter said he found it "unacceptable that we have in effect condended." unacceptable that we have in effect condoned the efforts of some Arab countries to tell American businesses that in order to trade with one country or company they must observe certain restrictions based on race or religion. These so-called 'Arab boycotts' violate our standards of freedom and morality.'

Speaking the next day, Ford said the boycott "involves both moral and legal questions, domestic as well as international legals."

mestic as well as international issues. easy to escalate emotionally but not nearly so easy to remove rationally." He said that as President he had "taken the strongest executive action in American history against foreign economic practices that discriminate against American citizens," He said his administrative orders and regulations "together with careful diplomacy and the efforts of individual United States firms, has resulted in easing the boycott practices and an effective end to open discrimination."

On one bitter, cold occasion, some printers noticed the elderly Ochs in deep conversation with the Sister. The next week and the ones following she was not at the

Thinking the worst, a call was made by some Catholic employees to the church on West 42nd

Street. A parish Priest answered the phone.
"Yes, Mr. Ochs had personally requested that
the practice be discontinued."
"He did, eh," fumed the indignant caller,
but before he could finish the Priest continued: Ochs did not want the lady to suffer in the cold. The church has been receiving a check each week for double the amount collected." It may still be in effect.

The second incident took place about ten years ago.

Arthur Ochs Sulzberger, a succeeding N.Y. Times publisher, received the following letter:

Dear Mr. Sulzberger:

Kindly pardon me for encroaching on your previous time and charity, but a letter from a poor Priest begging me to ask someone to build a little church for his sick and aged parishioners so they would not have to travel so far, prompts me to do this.

Your name came to mind, though you are not of our Religion, your people have always been generous to our Church.

If, on account of the many demands made on you, Mr. Sulzberger, you cannot do anything, you might know someone who could and would like to have their memory perpetuated in a little church in the West of Ireland.
